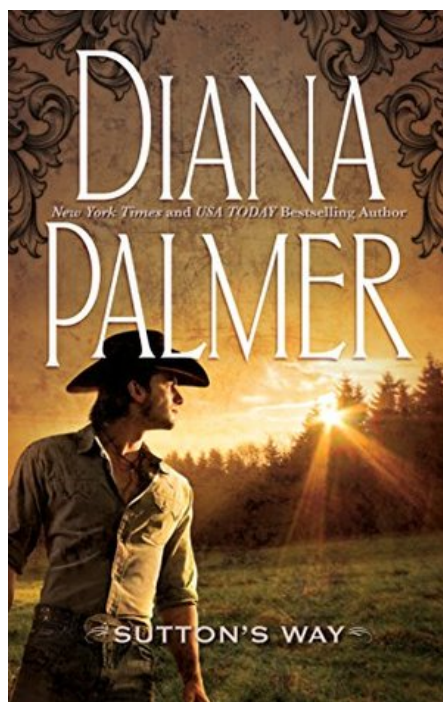




Sutton's Way

It gave me personally the first glimpse of Desperado a rock band Diana frequently mentions in many of her other books. I've never read any that directly deal with the band besides The Rancher.. Sutton's Way is about Amanda their lead singer. She is trapped in a snow storm in Wyoming near a failing ranch. The owner is Quinn Sutton & he has a little boy Elliot. Quinn becomes violently ill & Elliot panics and rushes to his nearest neighbor for help. Amanda who is a very nice person obliges. She helps him & then she returns home only to be stranded in a snow storm with no power.. Quinn Sutton begrudgingly comes to her rescue. They are forced to live in close proximity at his ranch. She hides her true identity the Grammy winning rock star, and he is a notoriously shy scorned man. He becomes fond of her but they each have lots of hang-ups (Diana's favorite word for it)... Diana Palmer has a similar pattern as does Julien James, Kresley Cole, Linda Lael Miller, and Kristan Higgins but it never bothers me.. They tweak each story enough to keep me interested. Plus the characters mean most to me & so what if they are similar in certain ways... I am just easy to please.

Of all the stories Diana Palmer has written and labeled as "Long, Tall Texans" stories, the most compelling and most poignant happens to be about a hero who was bred, born, and raised in Wyoming.

But what sets Sutton's Way apart from countless others of the sweet, contemporary romance genre is that both the hero and heroine are virgins.

Abused as a child, she ran away to find fame and fortune as a musician and singer, only to retreat to the mountains to recuperate from a concert tragedy. She's afraid of men.

He was a shy, awkward youth, persuaded to rescue a pregnant girl, but their marriage was never consummated. After the birth of her son, she was killed in an accident with the child's father, leaving our hero with a little boy who is not his own. He's now 30+ and all he knows about sex is what he's read in books.

The story is well-told and so unique, it stands out in one's memory long after the reading is done.
