And that is exactly what Nick Vujicic has done. Born without any arms and legs, Nick could be expected to give up, overwhelmed by the difficulties of life facing someone with such disabilities.

Nick did no such thing.

In *Unstoppable*, Nick describes the power of faith and how it has enabled him to do things he, or anyone else, ever thought possible.

In the book, Vujicic talks about his struggles, from being bullied to thoughts of suicide. he talks about lessons learned, from faith and love to financial difficulties. And he talks about dependence and independence, depending on God more and depending upon himself less.

Here's what I liked about *Unstoppable*: Nick tells his story, and it is fascinating. He also adds the stories of several people he has met who have overcome tremendous obstacles in their lives, and how they have stayed faithful to God in the process.

On the other hand, though, there were a few things I didn't like about the book. While the content was excellent, Nick's writing style aggravated me. It didn't flow well, and jumped around too much. Some chapters were hard to follow because of this. It seemed, at times, like rambling.

All in all, I enjoyed reading the book. And the points he made in each of his chapters were solid. This is a book I can certainly hand out to teens in my youth ministry who may be struggling. I'm sure it will be encouraging to them, as much of it was to me. I'm sure it will be to you as well.

Even without arms & legs, because, according to Vujicic everyone can experience the released powers from above. Yes, a lot of self-affirmation, positive language, goal-setting, and feel good messages, dipped in)(American) Christianity. The dream come true: a ministry, speaking opportunities all over the globe, successful book sales, DVD's and even a genuine girlfriend willing to break off her relationship with a boyfriend to start a new one with Nick.

Faith in action....according to the author. And yes, there's such thing as a financial crisis, even hitting *Life Without Limbs* and *Attitude is Altitude* Headquarters. Still, you can overcome personal crisis, relationship issues, career and job challenges, health and disability concerns, self-destructive thoughts, emotions, and addictions. Get rid of bullies, persecutors, cruelty and intolerance. Seek ye first balance in body, mind, heart

and spirit and serve others. Leaders lead the way, followers believe them. And, obviously, Nick Vujicic wants to be a leader, a source of inspiration to others.

Faith in action sounds like a mantra in this book. It leaves me puzzling what exactly is meant. In the real world I discovered there are more complex problems that can't be solved by positive affirmation and re-programming your paradigms, and beliefs system alone. I missed certain human elements. OK, you see an adorable, beautiful girl, like the one dreamt of all of your life. You dare to move, break the ice and start a conversation. Kanae returns your signals. The electricity is powerful.....and now let God enter the stage, give his approval, pray and fast about it.

Note the huge, if not overwhelming amount of "I..." sentences in the book. It's the unstoppable, enthusiastic, energy-driven Nick...alone. Of course, his audience will admire his position, both private and professional despite his physical disabilities. But, what's next to the "Yes, you can!" message?

Unstoppable is the sort of book that's hard to review. It's tempting to just say, "You really need to go read this book," and leave it at that, trusting the book to speak for itself. But of course, the point of a review is to encourage the reader to try the book in the first place, and after that, it's always up to the story.

The trouble I have with many non-fiction inspirational books is their tendency to offer formulas or blueprints for how to succeed. And if you disagree with one point, or one step doesn't apply to you, the rest of the information can seem equally invalid. Rather than take this approach, Mr. Vujicic takes a very conversational approach. He tells stories of problems he's faced and questions he's struggled with, and he shares what helped him. At that point, it's up to the reader whether the book is an amazingly inspiring story, or a source of inspiration.

You might think from the cover that the focus of the book is overcoming the obstacle of living without arms and legs, but most of book focused on much more mundane issues. Handling failure, overcoming depressions, coping with bullying, dealing with financial trouble, and falling in love are just a few, and Mr. Vujicic weave his own stories through the big picture issues with humor and humility. His constant conclusion that the answers lay with God and a relationship with Him never came across as trite. Rather, they seemed a gift.

Some people possess the rare ability to make themselves completely vulnerable to others. Telling stories about their lives and their trials isn't egoistical, it is an offering. It gives us a chance to learn from them and since they have no way of knowing what God can use, they give it all. One person might take comfort in the fact that another person has overcome childhood bullying. Another might be consoled that moments of doubt aren't signs of a weak faith. Mr. Vujicic is one of the people who can extend this grace, and I would encourage you to give Unstoppable a try. You have no idea what might be waiting.

The main strength of this book is how Nick uses anecdotes from himself, the Bible and the people he interacted with to convey his message. Wow! Such a powerful story. From the get-go, *Unstoppable* pulled me into its pages and immersed me emotionally with Nick's honest and humble writing. It's an easy read, in that, Nick's author voice is smooth and light. But, on the other end, his stories are heavy, filled with harsh realities and pain. The feelings expressed are a rollercoaster of emotions.

I found Nick's heart on his challenges and victories to be eye-opening. The true-life stories he included of the people in his book were heart-rending, but full of grace. These people needed to be heard, and I'm so glad Nick mentioned them. Their stories will impact lives.

Drawing from his own past, Nick offers advice and encouragement to those experiencing bullying, depression, thoughts of suicide, cutting - anyone who's felt left in the shadows. His message for life is simple: love God, serve humanity. If you see someone in pain, help them.

Fancy Vacation.

Two Homes.

Perfect Health.

No. None of those things. If that was his message, he would not have been able to preach it to the people he does. Nick has told men dying of AIDs in prison. Elderly ladies in a nursing homes. Girls in India who had been kidnapped and sold into the brutalizing "sex trade." When Nick says that we can all have a ridiculously good life he is telling the truth. As R. C Sproul Jr says, "The Good Life is knowing God". And I would add, knowing and loving your brethren. That is what Nick is saying. The Ridiculously Good Life is a life of rich relationships and Christian Service. Christ can reach us anywhere, rescue us from any sin, and comfort us in any pain. God our Father can show us His love in the prison or the nursing home. And then we can take and give this love to the world in Christ's Name. People made in the image of God need our help and love in schools where innocent victims are being bullied and the men and women who are self destructing, believing the cunning, deadly lies of the enemy that there is no hope, and attempting suicide all around us. And some succeed. Those who don't often live with the shame of having tried. Having failed to "have it all together". And we as the Church, so often don't know how to reach them. We don't want to get involved in anybody's business. We fear being pushed away. We aren't sure how to tell them there is Hope. Hope in Christ and Him alone. That is the message Nick brings. God is love. God loves you. God's kindness towards you should cause you to repent of your sins and trust Him. This book is filled with examples of absolute brokenness, transformed by God who rescues His children. Nick is no stranger to doubt, fear, and pain. As a boy he feared being a burden to his parents and told himself he would die so as not to burden them. How wrong he was! His parents thank God for blessing them with their son! Nick feared that no woman would love him. Wrong again! My favorite photo is on the back flap- Nick and his beautiful wife. They look so happy together.

There is a lot worth thinking about here. We as the Church need to think, and ACT to stop bullying, suicide, desperation, hopelessness. I love the stories about how God has used Nick in the lives of other children born without limbs. He tells us about one lovely little girl and one dear little boy especially, that he has been able to work with their parents to show them that their baby is not going to have a horrible life-not at all!!! God even used Nick in a village where the people were murdering the babies born without limbs. When they saw him, and his joy and energy, they saw that their children could grow up to do good things. Missionaries report that there have been no more killings in those villages after Nick visited.

In one story that Nick recounts he quotes a man who talks about how his Church stepped up and began to work and live in the community to make a difference. They took over doing things that the city could not pay to have done. They found out that when the Church moved out into the community, the community realized that there was something different about the Church. This is so true and needful. Last week we drove into town and along a street full of bars. On the left hand side was historic, stone and brick Churches. I could not help but wonder if the men and women in those buildings ever reached out to the people on the streets, the lost souls who are entering the temples of drunkenness. Somewhere in the story, someone said that they realized that doctrine needed to stop dividing them. What I can do to help us understand this is to quote Ravi Zacharias, who said that doctrinal differences come in two kinds, Form and Substance. Form is a difference in the outward way we do things. Substance is a real difference in what we believe. We must reach out, and we must give each other Grace. We must not ever give up doctrine. We need to reach out in real ways with the Love of God. Doctrine, the systematized Truths of the Faith, tell us what Love is, and Who God is.

Without those doctrines we could never give people the true, saving Message. In other words, we need the Faith in action!
