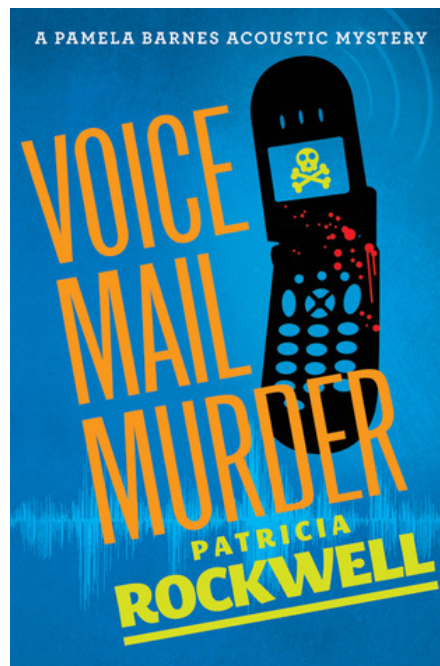




Voice Mail Murder

This was my least favorite of the three. It also cements one of my problems with these novels: obvious facts surrounding the murders are omitted until the last pages.

In this book, a brief mention is made of the murder weapon being two-pronged. That's a big clue when looking for murder weapons. But the detective NEVER LOOKS for an appropriate weapon. I knew what it was almost immediately and, thus, knew the killer but it wasn't related to the "acoustics" so it was completely bypassed.

Same was true in book 2 where autopsy results regarding angle of entry, already in police hands, are never mentioned until Dr. Barnes determines a clue through her analysis of the sound.
