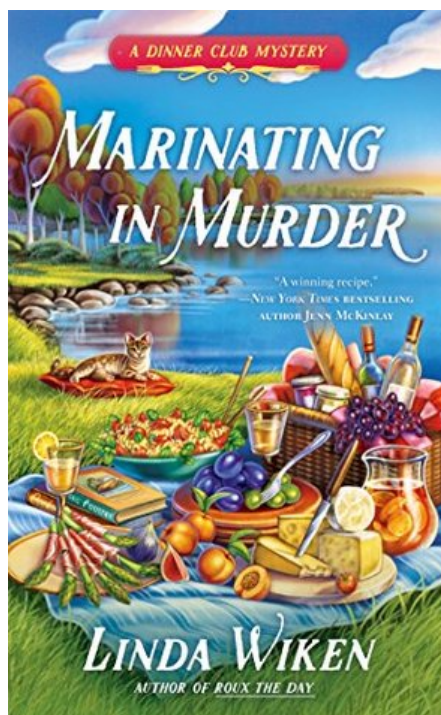




Marinating in Murder

When Alison comes out and unlocks her SUV and lifts the hatchback she lets out a scream. Inside the SUV is the body of her estranged husband. They were in the process of divorcing, but James never has the time to finalize the paperwork.

Having recently read Roux the Day it was fun to revisit these characters so soon. Alison had been pretty quiet about her personal life and her friends were pretty surprised when she had to fill them in on everything. They focused quickly on the new suspect that was brought to light, but she seemed to have an alibi. Private Eye Ty Devine has agreed to work with J.J. on the case both because he wants to help Alison but he also wants to spend time with J.J. He is not happy when she agrees to go on a date to get information, especially when it is followed by another date. J.J. is also confused about her feelings for both men.

Linda Wiken has given us such strong characters. I love the way they are still getting to know each other and have each other's back no matter what. The club has a nice variety of cooks and bakers from expert to novice and the cookbooks and recipes never fail to make my stomach growl. Like J.J. I love the cookbooks with all the beautiful pictures. Skye and J.J. have many events coming up at "Make It Happen" but it is the perfect job for J.J. because she sets her own hours and has a boss/friend that understands her sleuthing on the side. The whole group are fun and very engaging.

I really enjoyed the way the author had J.J. seeing both men while trying to find the killer. It added not only romantic tension but excitement to the story. It did seem though at times J.J. was rehashing the same thing over and over again. She kept meeting with people to try to get them to answer questions I thought they had already answered. Review:

Marinating in Murder is the third book in author Linda Wiken's Dinner Club Mystery series. I think this is my favorite. The characters are now fully developed and I feel like I know them much better. I did wish Ness was involved more, but that is just me. The Culinary Capers Dinner Club is still going strong and the friendships between the members is more enjoyable. Police officer Alison Malkovich is hosting the next dinner and she has decided a picnic would be just the ticket. Unfortunately an uninvited guest shows up in

Alison's SUV. The body of her ex or not husband has been put in the storage area, making it hard for the crew to load up their picnic supplies. And of course putting a hold on everything. Protagonist J.J. has to help her friend even if Alison says not to do it.

Alison is suspended from the police force and is also the prime suspect. None of the club members really know the whole story about her ex-husband. She is so private. Then the bomb drops as it is learned that her ex or not husband was leading a double life. He was married to both Alison and another woman. More motive stacks up on Alison and it does not look good. It is up to the Dinner Club members and J.J. in particular to find the answers. As her job as event planner J.J. has to put all the pieces together to come up with the perfect event. She uses these same skills to hunt down the answers and find the real killer.

Alison's ex/not ex's life is hard to filter through, but the Dinner Club is not going to give up until they prove Alison's innocence. J.J.'s favorite PI, Ty Devine is actually willing to help this time. He also seems to be warming up to her. And that is not the only man showing interest in her. The estranged husband's brother-in-law is not only hunky, but seems to enjoy her company. Luckily Ty is watching out for her and keeps her from being the next body to pop up. Action, intrigue, fun and great relationships make this installment my favorite in the series.

I think you could easily read Marinating in Murder without reading the other books in this series, but read them anyway. They are good too. I thought I knew who the killer was early on, then changed my mind as things started to be revealed. I did figure out what was going on a bit before J.J., but it was fun following her through all the action in the reveal. Foodies will love this book and this series. Great recipes are included as well. I agree with J.J. that cookbooks need more photos too, lol. A fun romp of intrigue filled with foodie fun.

Marinating in Murder, the third book in the Dinner Club Mystery series by Linda Wiken, is a nice addition to culinary cozies! J.J. Tanner is part of the Culinary Capers Dinner Club and has made several new friends since she joined. With each book the reader learns more about J.J. and the members of the dinner club although this book can be read as a standalone. Ms. Wiken provides enough details so new readers won't feel lost but doesn't stray from the plot line which keeps the story moving at a good pace. One of the members, Alison, has always been very private. None of their group knows her that well but most assume that she's reticent about herself because she's a cop. But when the body of her estranged husband is found in the back of her SUV and she's the number one suspect, the group pulls together to give her support and J.J. vows to clear Alison's name. I so enjoyed seeing the group's camaraderie and as the story progresses, friendships deepen. J.J. is quite tenacious and, at times, is willing to step on toes to find answers to prove Alison's innocence. The more questions she asks the more suspects come to light and I was surprised by the reveal.

I also loved the mentions and descriptions of the cookbooks the group cooks from and I agree with J.J.: the more photos in cookbooks the better. You'll get hungry by all the mentions of food and lucky for us readers and cooks, Ms. Wiken includes delicious recipes at the back of the book.
