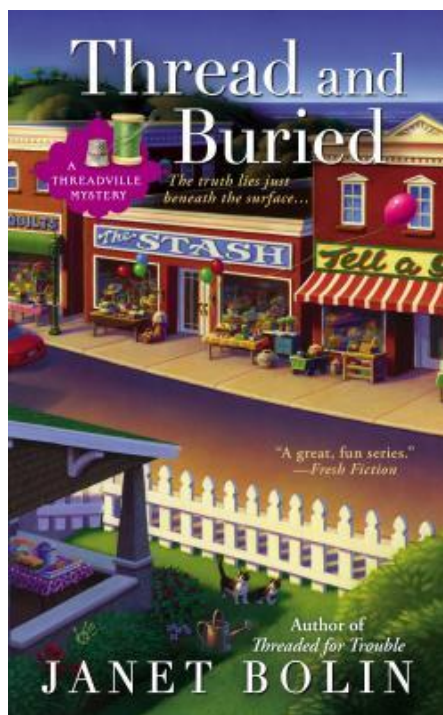




Thread and Buried

Long lost family members, new love interests and a burgeoning love interest between Willow and Clay make this a great read. Lots of details and characters all neatly sewed up in a tantalizing tale.
