It's no secret that I detest Olivia. So reading about her getting an HEA? Sorry. I just can't.

This is the first book about cheating that I didn't manage to finish. Guess I'll blame Olivia for it.

SPOILERS AHEAD

The sole reason I gave this book 2.5 stars is a very big one for me. It was the way the cheating was handled after the fact, more specifically the way the person being cheated on was held accountable for Olivia and David's actions. I didn't like the way David handled Bill, it was tacky and honestly cruel. Yes Bill said some very hurtful things to Olivia, but what did they expect? Bill's never been my favorite but he was angry and hurt and betrayed, no shit he's going to lash out...he's only human. Considering the astronomical mistakes David and Olivia made in the series, you'd think they'd be more understanding of that. Considering they are FAR from perfect themselves you would THINK they'd understand him better. David did not think Bill was worthy of Olivia (when it's not David's place to judge) but at the end of the day Bill was always loyal and never broke her trust. Which isn't everything granted, but it's more than Olivia can say for herself. Every time Bill did something resentful and out of anger he was treated with malice and physical violence by David. Like Bill didn't have a reason in the world to lash out? Every single human being in the world makes mistakes but to act as if he didn't do anything wrong did not make me like David very much. His only explanation is that he'd go to any lengths for Olivia. Which while it's a sweet sentiment, he needed to understand that Bill is also a living breathing HUMAN being with feelings and he has been betrayed by someone he trusted. He called Olivia some names in anger but honestly if I was in his position I think I would have said much much worse.

Again, I'd like to say that for two people like Olivia and David who fucked up very badly, their level of understanding for another human being left much to be desired from me.

In fact there's a part near the end when Bill angrily wants to expose David as a home wrecker, and Olivia says that HE(Bill) is the one that wrecked their relationship and proceeds to threaten him. GOD I HATED her at this point. Bill's fault according to her was that he never asked questions, never TRIED to get her to open up. These are all true. But the things she's now disdainfully accusing him of are the things she was with him for. He was "safe." It's not Bill's fault that Olivia **CHANGED**. As a husband Bill left much to be desired but bottom line is that it took two to make their marriage and when she accused HIM of ruining them I was LIVID. She knew exactly who she was marrying and she was happy with him until David came along. I don't think Olivia is a bad person because she changed and discovered there was more out there but the way she blamed Bill was wrong to me on so many levels. She has no reason to be angry at Bill for the very reasons she was with him. OF COURSE Bill will be angry at the man who slept with his wife....or is it that I'm missing something here? She took it as some sort of personal affront. David was wrong for sleeping with a married woman, period. Instead of recognizing it, he gets angry and fights with Bill. Classy. I, needless to say did not feel the David love so many other readers did. He was alpha to the extreme and many times way too suffocating.

Something I know people have been angry about was how Lucy dropped Olivia as a friend after she finds out about the cheating. This was sad to watch especially since the earlier encounters between the girls show that Lucy and Olivia really do care about one another. Cheating sucks, but so does abandoning your friends. I

guess the question is what do you do when someone you care about does something that goes against every single thing you believe in? It's a tough situation to be in definitely, but you can still be yourself and be there for your friend. Lucy did not have to like or support the cheating at all in order to be there for her friend. In fact, imo the best of friends are the ones who are straight up and tell you how it is. You're never going to find someone that agrees with you on *everything*. I think what bothered Lucy more was that Olivia was leaving Bill and not trying to work things out, when honestly leaving Bill was the best thing to do for everyone involved.

Here's my take on Olivia's marriage (stuff from all 3 novels): Olivia was always closed down and afraid of getting hurt due to her childhood issues and married someone safe (Bill); Olivia didn't want to open up about her inner demons and Bill didn't try hard enough to get her to open up so she didn't have to worry about getting too close, and therefore getting hurt down the line. She has a content, happy life with him. This worked fine for Olivia up until she meets David. Their eyes connect and a "feeling" goes through them in typical new adult novel fashion, a few short meetings later they're madly in love obviously. David is the exact opposite of Bill, he "sees" her and truly knows her after making eye contacts for a few seconds at the ballet (he tells her so). Now despite how eye rolley that is to me I can see why she falls for David, he's attentive, pushes her to open up..he makes a huge effort and focuses all his attention on her. Fine. Cool. The point I'm trying to make is that this love she feels for David **changes her**. She is no longer happy with the status quo relationship she has with safe Bill and proceeds to cheat on him multiple times. However just because she changes does not mean Bill does. ***Which is why I get so angry when she throws blame at the person she is cheating on, Olivia starts to resent Bill for the very reasons he was deemed 'safe' in the first place.

I get that everyone makes mistakes but the way she goes about the cheating is gros, she cheats without regrets and admits to herself that she would do it again. In fact I think she romanticizes the cheating, she "couldn't not do it." She does say that she feels horrible for what she's doing to Bill but then with the same breath that she doesn't regret her nights with David. Since her nights with David ARE what is hurting Bill this statement makes no sense. Not to mention soon after she hears Bill crying himself to sleep she proceeds to have sex with David in her husband's bed....not exactly the picture of remorse or guilt imo.

I feel like I and other readers deserve medals for our patience with this couple. So, it's all smooth sailing now, right?

HA!!! It's as if you don't know this author at all. Have you not been paying attention?!?!

All joking aside, this book was definitely less angsty compared to the two previous books, which nearly sent me to the hospital. But there is angst, courtesy of come on, you can guess . . .

Yes, Olivia. Even now having taken the big leap with David, she seems to have second thoughts just about every two hours. Ok, maybe I'm exaggerating, but it felt like it was at least daily. Her second guessing was mostly due to Bill. Yes, good ol' Bill. I had to keep reminding myself that he is not the bad guy in this series, but he really annoyed the shit out of me in this book. I haven't really talked about Olivia's friends in the previous books, but each have a very important stance in this book that greatly affects Olivia's emotional roller-coaster. Let's get the bad out of the way. Lucy, bless her soul. I was completely torn with her reaction to Olivia leaving Bill. On the one hand, it showed how damaging affairs can be beyond the couple. On the other hand, she really didn't give Olivia a chance at forgiveness. She picked a side, the easy one, and walked. Then there is Gretchen. She also is there to push Olivia when she begins to overthink things.

While Olivia could be grating at times, David is beyond swoonworthy in this book. Whew...finally finished the "Come" Trilogy and I must say, it was a fantastic emotional roller coaster. Jessica Hawkins succinctly captured the desperation, angst, confusion and complexity involved with a romantic/sexual entanglement outside of one's marriage. Hawkins took it even further by detailing a scenario in which a person pursues their soul mate even though it turns out said soul mate is **not their spouse**.

(Spoiler alert) When I read book 1 I was rather perturbed with Olivia's inability to simply **commit to a decision**. Either pick Bill and make it work, or pick David and leave Bill behind. Of course, she dragged out the decision and hurt both her love interests unnecessarily. Olivia kept doubting her decision to be with David even after she had left her husband. This just added to the complexity of choosing to leave your husband for the man you cheated with. I do not condone infidelity, however, I do condone being happy. I only wish there was a less sloppy way for Olivia to have ensured her happiness. If only Olivia would not have took vows and committed to a man she truly was not in love with (Bill). Or maybe if she had pursued counseling when she realized that her marriage was failing. Or if she had tried a trial separation before jumping into things with David. If only she'd insisted that David not be involved in her and Bill's quest for a house. If only there was a less messy way to pursue your happiness without the emotional fallout. Then again I think that was the message of the trilogy - there is no nice and tidy way to fall out of love. In the end, breaking vows, emotionally/physically cheating, and coming to grips that you 'settled' for someone, leads to devastating emotional fallout and life-altering consequences. It reeked of reckless juvenile immaturity a la Dawson's Creek, but I ate up every gut-wrenching scenario.

OLIVIA. Her immaturity, or simple inability to recognize her dysfunctional marriage, left me wondering if she was truly an adult. I honestly didn't see why David pursued her so relentlessly - there wasn't anything unique about her. I was a bit annoyed with Olivia's pushover-ness. She even questions her unwavering desperate devotion to be with David - "Was there anything I wouldn't do, wouldn't give up for him?" I thought that Olivia was a lost and distraught child. She was lost before she even married Bill. And she just became incapable of controlling her own life. Olivia became a backseat passenger as her life passed her by and people made decisions for her. I wished for a stronger more relatable female lead but...c'est le vie.

DAVID. Alpha-male? Spoiled brat? Domineering and aggressive? Yes to all of the above. My only qualm with David was that he just kept pushing!! Olivia seemed to be rational, well at least in the respect of not wanting to rush their relationship or become solely dependent on him financially. But David left absolutely no room for any compromise. My feminist side was screaming in protest as Olivia caved, time after time, to David's aggressive and over-protective behavior. There were many displays of violence and total domination that concerned me.

BILL. Damn damn damn. The way the story was written it was hard to tell if Bill was the bad guy or the good guy. He could be considered the bad guy because he really didn't care to know Olivia or what troubled her. He expected her to get over her emotional issues, stemming from childhood, all by herself. He wasn't interested in her hobbies, didn't bother to have deep conversations with her, and became a workaholic instead of dealing with pressing issues at home. However, I felt extremely sympathetic for him because ultimately, he remained faithful. In spite of all his faults, he never once violated his vows of fidelity. The sheer desperation he displayed in trying to win Olivia back, albeit way too late, was heart-breaking. I do wish he had displayed more intuition and sensitivity before Olivia had met David, instead of disregarding all signs of a dysfunctional relationship.

The topic of infidelity and divorce are toughies but Hawkins wrote eloquently and each page was filled with

emotion and passion. The writing was impeccable, and the drama was perfect. Makes you think twice about what you would or wouldn't do to be happy or find real love.
