This book follows Talia & Erik during the same time frame as EXILED: KENLY'S STORY. If, like me, you wondered what was going on with our favorite Talented couple while Kenly was in London, imprisoned by the Poachers; you are about to find out.

I was impatiently waiting to read "Marked" the entire time I was enjoying "Exiled." As good as it was to see this new unstable and dangerous world through Kenly's eyes, it was good to get back to events from Talia and Erik's perspectives. "Marked" takes us back to the style Sophie wrote "Captivated" in where we get to go back and forth between Erick and Talia's experiences from chapter to chapter.

There're no shortages of examples of how far Talia and Erick will go for one another but I really loved how "Marked" took us to the extremes of their sacrifices. Erick has to make a deep emotional sacrifice to save someone that Talia cares deeply for. That of course proves challenging with the carnal emotional state Erick

has been in since being experimented on. We really get to see his true strength in being able to bottle his rage and do what he has to to make Talia happy. We get to see Talia do the same, literally risking everything to save someone Erick cares for. Talia and Erick both create an "Einstein-Rosen Bridge" between being superhuman and completely human simultaneously. They're both selfish when it comes to one another and they both struggle to control their power when something sets them off about the other but, they are fully selfless when it comes to doing anything for one another. The pacing that their relationship has grown up to this point has been perfect in that things seem to have progressed really quickly, but in actuality across the last few books it's been really organic and they still seem to have so far to go in the growth of their love.

We were introduced to some new "players" in "Exiled" that posed an entirely new threat to the Talented and Created. Sophie manage to introduce us to yet another power player that may or may not be benevolent towards the Talented and Create without overshadowing the dangers the threat from "Exiled" posed. Someone one Talia's past resurfaces with strange markings that seem familiar but Talia's not able to place from where, but she knows the person bearing these markings shouldn't be there. Sophie really did a great job of paying us off from the events of "Exiled" but let us hanging with this new "player."

"Marked" was such a fun read. Even though it paralleled the events of Kenly's story, it never felt like Sophie was recycling anything from "Exiled." Both books stand firmly on their own but when put together, compliment one another perfectly.
