I wanted to read this book because the plot appealed to me given the popularity of the "hot highlander/modern lady" time travel fated love. The story revolves around Carol Harper, a woman who finds a ring she is immediately drawn to, and upon putting it on is "zapped" back several hundred years. Angus McClean, clan chieftain, is on a mission to avenge his murdered wife and infant son (along with many other innocent victims of his clan) in England when he hears a woman screaming and is compelled to seek her out. When he finds her, they are both struck by intense feelings, but they must navigate treacherous obstacles before they can determine whether it is meant to be.

What I liked about this book:

- the main characters were likeable
- the female character wasn't a helpless pushover
- the story line idea was interesting

What I didn't like as much:

- there was a "fated" element to this book that had potential, but I felt like it didn't quite get there for me to feel that it could be believable (obviously, time travel is not possible, yet when I read Outlander, it almost seemed like it "could happen;" I didn't feel things click that way in this one)
- the romance went from 60 to 0 to 0 to 0 to 60.... there wasn't a very good build-up to it
