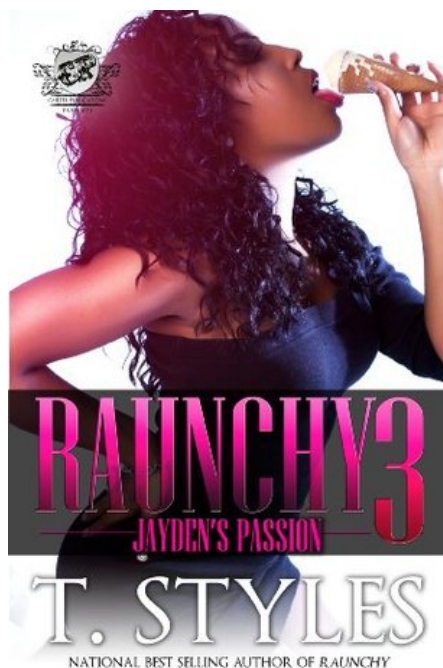




Jayden's Passion

There were too many scenes in this book that I just didnt care about.
