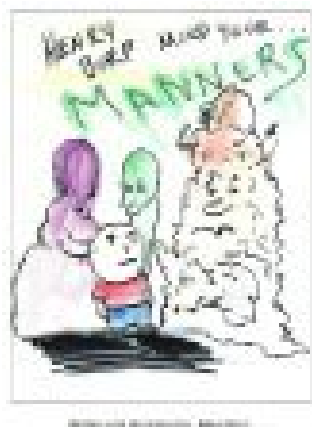




Henry Burp - Mind Your Manners
