Bite Me, I'm Yours by Stacy McKittrick feels much like a contemporary romance would, with the exception that it has a light touch of paranormal feel to it thanks to a hunky, bartender who also just happens to be a vampire as well. The cover immediately drew me with its kissing couple and its fun title for sure. The author Stacy McKittrick is new to me, and I was hoping for a paranormal romance with strong and exciting characters all wrapped-up in a fun and contemporary setting. Overall, it was an entertaining read, although different than I had originally anticipated.

I will say the best part of the story, for me, was reading about how these two completely different individuals (a Beta-styled Vampire and Distrusting, Damsel-in-Distress) ended up together. The romance was sweet between John and Sarah, and I enjoyed watching all the romantic build-up between them.

Sarah has suffered a lot of abuse, both mentally and physically, at the hands of her ex-husband. She has a really hard time at first trusting John and, despite being attracted and intrigued by him she remains skittish and leery of his attention to her. This, and the fact that John is a vampire, a fact she does not know at first, and who has some really odd quirks about him like not eating in front of her and only able to see/date her at night, makes for some light and fun moments in the story.

John feels like your typical beta-male, except he's a vampire. He's sweet, intelligent, owns his own bar, yet he's also awkward when it comes to dating and relationships. As a fairly newly 'made' vampire - the idea of dating fills him with more dread than a wooden stake. But, of course there's something about Sarah that captures his attention and makes him want to protect and 'romance' her in a good, old-fashioned, Undead kind of way. Sweet, awkward, honest and sexy at times, I had fun in the end seeing these two get together.

I do want to mention that there were a few darker scenes/issues in the story that involves abuse, rape and even a kidnapping that lent a darker side to this story as well. So, please be warned.

There were a few issues within the story though that kept me from really enjoying *Bite Me, I'm Yours* as much as I had hoped for, and some of it is really my *personal preference* when it comes to a romance, and one that involves paranormal and vampires. The minor issues I had was the fact that John was not the typical alpha-male that I prefer, especially when it comes to being a vampire, and so I was disappointed in that aspect. And, as for Sarah, although I sympathized with her greatly, she seemed very weak and passive for a majority of the story before she gained some inner strength. My biggest issue, one that frustrated me and kept me from really enjoying the story, was the numerous rescues of Sarah throughout the story, turning her into a damsel-in-distress one too-many times for my personal taste.

So, while *Bite Me, I'm Yours* ended up being an overall entertaining read for me, the lack of strong characters that I prefer and too many rescues made it difficult for me to really feel really excited over the story and romance.

My Rating: 3.0 Stars. Entertaining, with a few issues.

I wasn't exactly sure what I'd find within the pages of Bite Me I'm Yours (BMIY), but the blurb had me intrigued. This story tells the tale of a romantically battered woman named Sarah who finds that she has a connection to local bar owner, John. She knows she's far from ready to re-join the dating game, but she can't get John out of her mind. Sarah throws caution to the wind and agrees to a date with him. One date leads to another, and before she knows it, she's dating a vampire. Sarah takes the news gracefully, but living life on the dangerous side isn't exactly new to her. When her troubled past and a serial killer come to haunt her, she has to survive first before she can explore her relationship with John.

I really enjoyed BMIY. It's refreshing to read about a vampire who just wants to live his life like normal person. Though John is far from normal, he wants to feel as he did before his humanity was taken from him. Sarah is that heavenly slice of humanity for him, but loving her comes at a serious price. Sarah's already dealing with a psychotic abusive ex husband. Add in a serial killer and a strange series of accidents, and you find that loving Sarah isn't exactly easy. I think what I liked most about this story was the sheer fact that the typical vampire personality and traits were bypassed. There was something about this cover, with the black and white characters and bold blood red word BITE, that drew me in. After reading the blurb, this sounded like a book I could get interested in. Additionally, this will be my first official KLove post (though I did request the book before I was approved).

When we first meet Sarah, she is on her way home from work. She has just left her work friend in the parking garage's elevator. As she is heading toward the bright yellow Xterra, that she habitually parks beside and has nicknamed Bumblebee, she gets attacked and very nearly kidnapped. If it weren't for John's timely arrival in the parking garage, Sarah would have been taken by serial killer.

When John spies a lone shoe on the floor next to his yellow SUV, he picks it up and smells strawberries, a scent that he often finds lingering around his car each day. He stops the attack and manages to get Sarah tucked into her car. Then he leaves with the would be killer to insure that he turns himself in for his past crimes. When he gets back, Sarah has driven off. John feels depressed because he never got a chance to find out who the mystery woman who smelled of strawberries was, but thinks it is better this way.

Sarah is a woman with a lot of baggage and a metric ton of issues related to her baggage. While John appears more together, in actuality, he too has his share of issues and baggage. As these two characters come to know one another, they help each other grow. There were moments when I cheered them on, and others when I wanted to smack one or both of them upside the head with a "Snap out of it" a la Moonstruck. Seriously.
