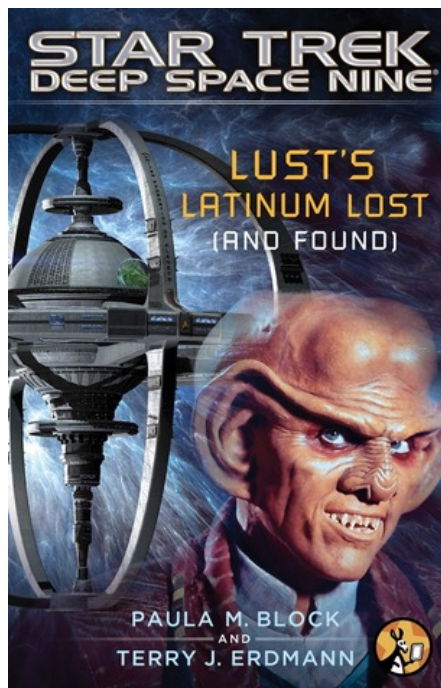




Lust's Latinum Lost (And Found)
