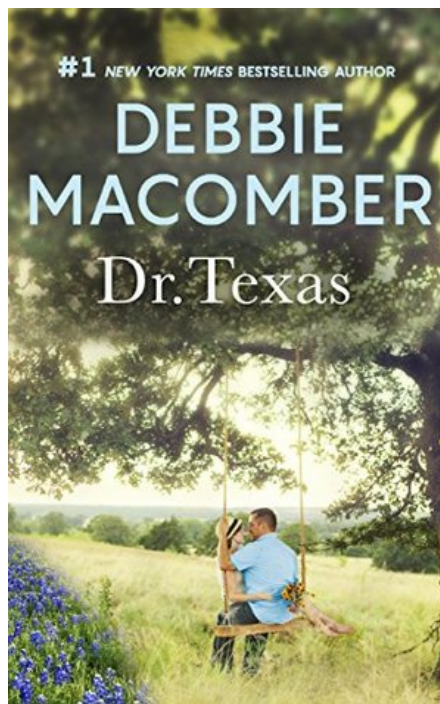




Dr. Texas: A Bestselling Western Romance
