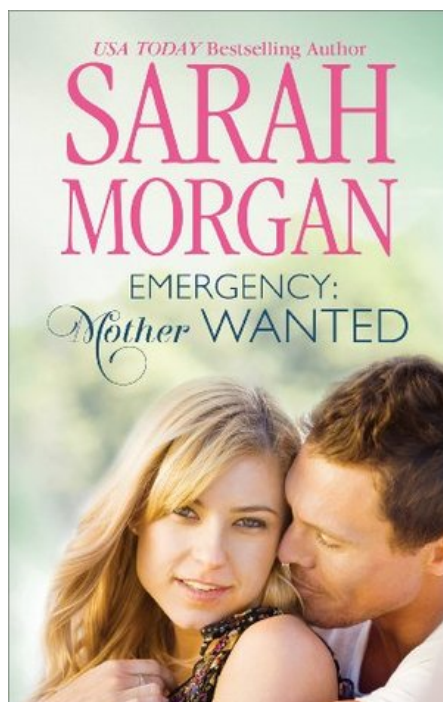




Emergency: Mother Wanted
