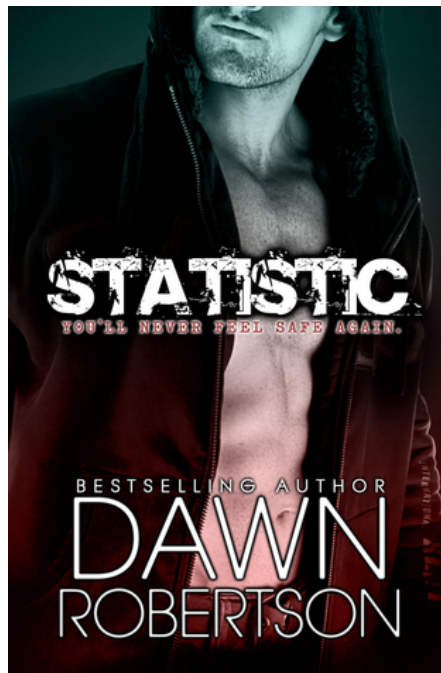




Statistic
