The story is the third book in the Barbarian Mates series, but will definitely read well as a stand-alone. There is a great cast of characters, with Barbarian Twins, Jaxon and Wolfe, and human slave girl, Ava. Ava's father was accused, tried, and hung for his crime while Ava's mother was pregnant with her, but the human law made them become slaves because of his crime, so that is all she has ever known.

Ava has dreamed of freedom, of what is beyond the dreary life in the dismal village she lives in, as a slave, but fear has kept her in place. When it comes to light that two of Monrock's slaves ran away, her Master discovers a bag with provisions and places her for sale on the auction block.

Jaxon is heading back to his home, but is drawn into the human village and sees a frightened beautiful girl being auctioned and an old man winning her bid. He will outbid him and take her as his. Humans greatly fear Barbarians, and while Ava didn't want to go with Elder Thomas, the Barbarian may be worse.

"I will keep you safe. I give you my word."

The plot will have Jaxon buying Ava at the human village when she is being sold at auction. He doesn't tell her he has no intention to keep her as a slave, but more than likely a paid servant. During the trip, they will have their ups and downs when she tries to run away, and he must punish her. What will his twin brother, Wolfe, think of this human? Could she be their chosen mate?

Banded brothers will claim a mate together, and before Jaxon and Ava arrive home, Wolfe dreams of her. Rules are laid out, punishments are explained, and obedience is expected. For the first time in her life, Ava will feel complete, as part of a family, not a slave looking in with hope, but as a revered mate.

"Though you will be our mate, Ava, we will forever be your masters. A female claimed by a pair of Banded males remains under the authority of her mates."

"Finally, after years of being alone and worrying for her future, she has two mates to call her own."

Trouble is coming, and visions will prepare the Banded men for the enemy. What will happen when Ava disobeys her mates and puts herself in danger?

The story is a ménage with two Barbarian brothers and their human mate. The story has several punishments, of different calibers, and explicit sex scenes. There is plenty of angst, determination, passion, and chemistry between the couples.

There's nothing to interest him here. Or is there? He feels an irresistible pull, and steps toward the auction block. What he sees enchants him. The little human female is so enticing. As Ava and Jaxon come to an uneasy truce, Wolfe's soon also affected by the little slave. It seems the Goddess has finally found the twins' fated mate, and she's a human! She's also no pushover. As the triad attempts to move past their cultural and lifestyle differences, events spin out of control. Ava's difficulty adapting to Banded customs is unacceptable. And danger from unknown sources soon literally arrives at the twins' front door. What can they do? Who would be willing to attack the Banded? They're ferocious, battle-hardened warriors. Although she doesn't admit it, Ava is the twins' mate. The Banded protect their women at all costs. And it's not just Jaxon, Wolfe, and Ava at risk.
