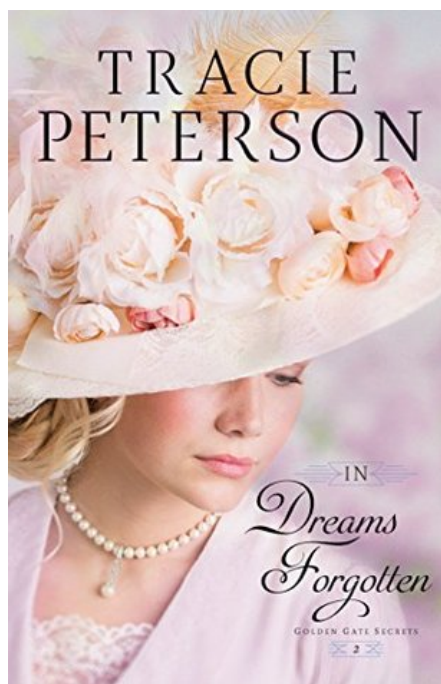




In Dreams Forgotten

Judith's family wasn't as developed as I would have liked to see, Vicky, William, Bill...just pretty much fillers in the story. I enjoyed reading Judith's story better than Camri's. I was able to connect with her more and I loved getting to see the tensions between the secondary characters. Caleb seems to not notice her at first, but I still feel that he himself had no idea that he was in loved until everyone told him and I wonder if the author needed to show more activity of him falling for her. I felt bad for Judith losing her new family again and having a hard time fitting in her new world.

There are still some unanswered questions left but the next book in the series will hopefully conclude the ending for Camri and Patrick, Judith and Caleb, and finally Kenzi and Micah. .
