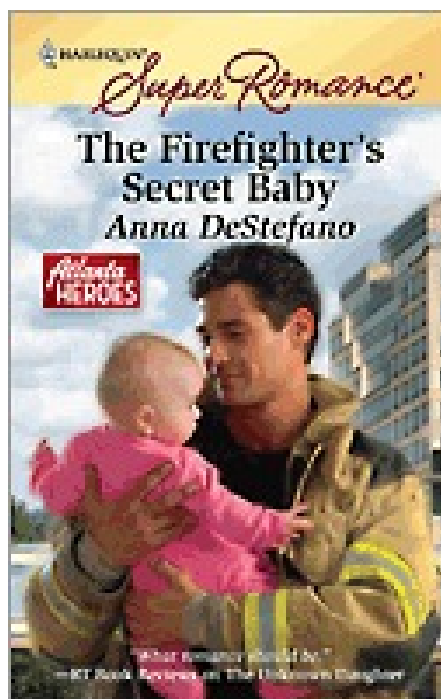




The Firefighter's Secret Baby
