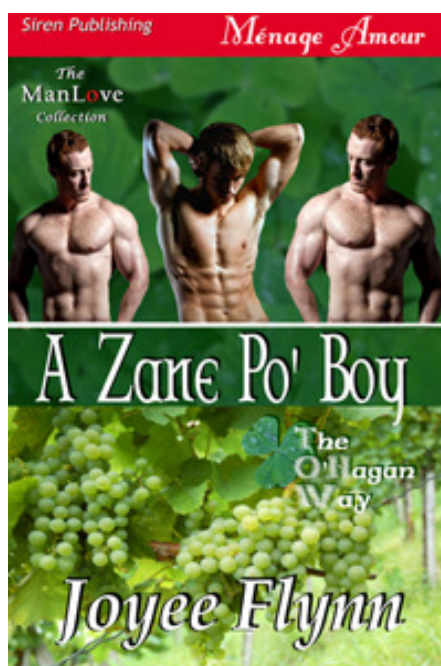




A Zane Po' Boy

A Zane Po' Boy is the third installment of Joyee Flynn's The O'Hagan Way series. This series is a sub-series of the Marius Brothers' (PNR, Vampires) and is based on the O'Hagan family who is a family of gay twins. This story revolves around the oldest of the O'Hagan brothers, Banning and Brian.

The book opens with Zane being accosted by Brian and Banning because they are SO excited to find their mate after over 600 years of looking. However, Zane comes with a lot of baggage and abuse and simply wants to slow things down. No one listens and the twins leave feeling rejected and Zane throws himself into his work.

After eight months, Zane's best friend sees that he is destroying himself and goes to Ireland to get Brian and Banning. The twins come right away and all three go about figuring out if they can overcome their issues and misunderstandings. There are some ups and downs, but eventually the trio works everything out. The book ends with an intriguing business deal that will bring a haven for discarded shifters under Zane, Brian and Banning's roof.

I enjoyed this story and look forward to other books in the various series by Ms. Flynn. One thing you should know before you read this is that the story is told in first person and alternates between all three main characters. As much fun, yet with some serious emotional drama, as the first two books in the series, this third volume tell Zane's story. He is Isaac's best friend and previously appeared in the Marius Brothers universe, and is an intriguing character whose story I have been anticipating. But even if you've never read a single one of those books, this one is pretty self-explanatory.

Zane is a vampire warrior with a past. I won't go into too much detail here, because what that is exactly is an integral part of the story twists and turns, but it is very unusual compared to that of the other warriors. His past rules him, and part of the growth he goes through once he meets his mates has to do with him finally facing some of the problems and being able to talk about them. It makes for some interesting revelations.

Brian and Banning are twins, but different to their brothers, the other two sets of Irish twins we have met in this series so far, they are not really close. It was a little disturbing to see, and I kept wondering what was going on, but when the solution finally comes, all became clear. Certainly an interesting twist and the cause of much confusion.

This is a book about the consequences of miscommunication – or, indeed, the lack of any communication at all. Misunderstandings are pretty much the only obstacles facing these three men, but they prove to be more difficult to overcome than expected. If you like stories about men finding their true family and a place they can call home, if you enjoy flawed characters who sometime act dumber than should be legal, and if you're looking for some very hot three-way action, you will probably like this book.

I actually love this series, but I couldn't finish this particular book. Which I guess is weird, since so many people apparently think this is the best book in the series (or even the best book from Joyee Flynn). But no, not for me. After only two chapters I found myself wanting to reach through the pages of the book and just smack all three of them on the back of the head. Pretty much all their issues at that point were caused by them making assumptions and not talking to each other. You'd think that, after they've screwed it all up once or twice by jumping to conclusions, they'd decide to at least NOT jump to conclusions AGAIN. But no, they just keep making the same mistake over and over.

The second thing that bothered me is the 'accent' the twins have. It's one thing to talk about them having an accent, even to give them some words to say that the others don't say (like 'me' instead of 'my' or 'ma and da' instead of 'mom and dad') but the way the twins talk it's like they don't even understand english at all. Simple words like 'a' and 'the' (which I know for a fact even english-speaking Irish people use in their speech) simply don't seem to exist anymore when the twins are talking. I get it, they're not American. No need to give me a headache trying to figure out what the proper English translation to EVERYTHING they're saying is.

I love Joyee's books, but this one I won't be finishing anytime soon. Maybe some day, when I have an hour or two to waste and I won't mind facing the headache and the utter stupidity that is this book.
