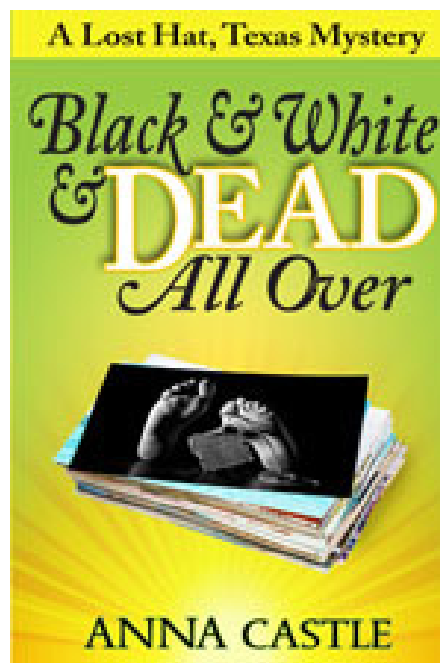




Black & White & Dead All Over (Lost Hat, Texas Mystery #1)
