Being a shorter story it moves at fast pace. The instant attraction between Hawk and Robyn worked well in this story. The characters were interesting and immediately likable. Who doesn't love a rough around the edges bad boy who is really a sweetheart. Loved that Robyn was a strong independent woman. She stayed

that way throughout the story. So many times the female lead starts out strong then just shrivels up, that didn't happen here.
