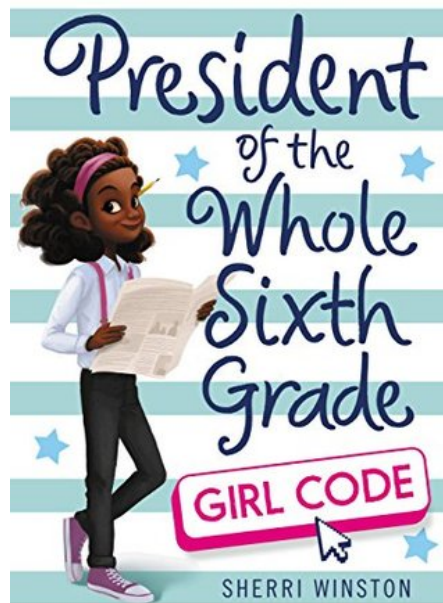

She feels the east side is "ghetto", not knowing how inflammatory that opinion is. This is a timely topic, but there's a bit of a disconnect between the covers and general setting of the book and this more serious topic that I'm not sure about. Brianna really wants to have an online cupcake baking business, but her parents think she is overtaxed with the journalism and competitive cheer, so she goes behind their backs to bring in her grandmother to try to persuade them. When her mother gets a chance at a really good promotion that means moving to Washington, D.C., Brianna doesn't want to go.

Brianna isn't a particularly nice character. The other two books don't circulate too well. I wish this topic were addressed somehow differently, but it's such an important one that I might buy the book anyway and try to hand sell it.
