The Boss is the first story in Abigail Owen's dragon shifter series, Fire's Edge. It's a smart and sexy story about Finn Conleth, leader of several dragon shifters from different European clans who've relocated to America. His mixed clan uses the cover of being smoke jumpers/wildfire firefighters to practice their fire-making skills in the immense California forests. They are responsible, putting out any fires they start and working with local fire authorities (who are unaware of their shifter nature) to combat any wildfires that threaten the population. Finn encounters a young woman, Delaney Hamilton, who is on the run from a stalker but also from a frightening experience that keeps happening to her: she finds herself blacking out and waking up in the middle of a fire. She's managed to escape every time, but the more often it happens, the more she wonders if she is somehow responsible. Lucky for her, Finn might be the one man who can find out the answers and save her life.

I really enjoyed this unique story and found the plot device of having dragon shifters act as firefighters in their human form to be an excellent way to explain their presence. There's some good worldbuilding, too, explaining the dragon shifter origins and how the clans work, as well as the mating rules. In this story, female mates are humans who have dragon shifter abilities though they don't come out until they are exposed to a dragon shifter male. If a mistake is made and the wrong mate is chosen, the human female will be incinerated so there is no room for error. Finn already lost one woman that way, so he's very leery of getting involved again, even though he is drawn to Delaney from the moment they meet.

Delaney has nothing to lose by confiding her crazy experiences to Finn since he's the one who rescues her from the fire at her friend's winery, her most recent hiding place. She knows her story sounds insane and that someone might think that she is an arsonist based on her proximity to recent unexplainable fires. When Finn finds out about Delaney's stalker, he becomes protective; and keeping her in close proximity also means she's bound to find out about the true nature of Finn and his crew. It turns out that the stalker after her has a specific agenda and there are some suspenseful, action filled scenes as the story plays out.

Not to be outdone by the rest of the story, the romance between Finn and Delaney is pretty steamy! There's an element of mutual exhibitionism kink that heats things up as they fall for each other. Finn can have sex with a woman without mating with her, but the more he finds out about Delaney and she about him, the more difficult he finds it to keep her (figuratively if not literally) at arm's length. There's an exciting conclusion to

the novel, and while this couple gets their happy ending, there's a hint of more trouble to come to entice readers to pick up the next in series. The Boss is a fiery (in more ways than one), action packed, sometimes suspenseful and thoroughly entertaining paranormal romance.

Well, bummer. I was hoping I'd found a new series to enjoy after reading the prequel, but now I'm not so sure.

Finn is the leader of a dragon enforcer/dragon fire control team in America. He is also a dragon who went through the claiming process for a mate and it failed. The dragon mate died when they tried to bond. He's never forgotten or forgiven himself for being so wrong. He vows to never try again as dragons lose a part of their soul in a failed mating. The guilt of having deprived another dragon of his true mate when they are so few and so precious is eating him alive. He can't even make love to a woman without seeing his dead, potential mate's face. He's closed off his heart and is emotionally cold. No longer the teasing, light-hearted man he used to be.

Delaney is on the run from a stalker. Fires follow her wherever she goes and she doesn't know if it's her or her stalker setting them as she blacks out every time.

The latest fire to plague her was set by a dragon, so Finn and his crew come to help put it out. Finn feels a pull toward Delaney at first sight, and she to him. She decides she has to tell someone what's going on and decides to trust Finn with her secret.

Finn and the other males think Delaney might be a dragon mate, but when the mark on her neck doesn't show up when prompted, they decide she's human and her stalker is a rogue dragon who is setting the fires and vow to help her. Finn is feeling very protective of her and the sexual draw is something he hasn't felt in a very long time. Though sex with a human can never be more than a brief affair, Finn can't resist Delaney for long.

Delaney isn't really my cup of tea, she's a bit too sexually aggressive for *my* taste, but other readers will love her. But, that was not my main issue with the romance in TB.

I hated that every other dragon in the crew could hear them having sex and it didn't bother her ... or Finn! Aren't shifters suppose to be possessive? I guess I was suppose to find this sexy? I personally did not. It even went so far as to Finn voicing a fantasy with all the guys watching him 'take' her, knowing the other males were listening while they got each other off to the fantasy. Though he stated she would really never go through with true voyeurism and he would never share her...it turned me off big time. She wasn't even really embarrassed and she has to face these men every day! \*shrug\* Um...okay.

I also had more concerns with plot holes/unanswered questions in regards to world building. How could Graff (view spoiler) We are told only dragons and their true mates can produce children. Then we are told

Cole's (dragon from the prequel) father had an affair with a (view spoiler) and Graff was born. HUH?? One, I wanna know if it was an affair AFTER he'd mated Cole's mother or before??? If after, that is a mate world I do not want to visit. We are told over and over how precious mates are, so stepping out on one makes ZERO sense.

We also have teasers of Titus having found his mate in the past, but he's not with her?? Okay...there can only be 4 reasons why he wouldn't be with her according to what we know about the world so far. Either she chose no mate and is trying to control her latent dragon with the Councils' help (which will eventually fail), she chose someone else and the mating worked (contradicting the belief there is only one true mate), she chose someone else and died in his mating fire, she wasn't really his mate or...they are separated. If separated, that blows the precious mate thing out of the water...again. I'm sure there is more to the story...but it bugged me not knowing how that would work.

There are many hinted plots going on in TB, which is expected at the start of a series. A traitor. Unstable politics. A rogue sent by the king in search of...something. The brewing clan wars. Rune. (And Finn has no room to talk about his ex-bestfriend after what he pulled with Delaney. Hypocrite!) Why didn't Delaney have the dragon mark??? Drake's sister and her brood of orphans. (I thought dragons lived a long time, longer when mated. How are all these dragon mates leaving so many orphans behind?? How are they dying??)

Oh...and then there are the twin dragons. It is being heavily insinuated that they will be claiming one mate (though that's admittedly not supposed to happen) and sorry, but menage is just not my thing. At all. Again, debunks the 'possessive' shifter thing and if I chose to carry on with the series, I would have to skip their book. I rarely read a series where I can't read it in its entirety. I hate it actually, and won't usually start a series at all if I know that's a possibility. The next book (not out yet) features a different dragon, but if I read it, I'll just be dragged further into a world I'm not sure is going where my preferences want it to go.

Their strength in character as a group was evident early on.

Finn Conleth has lived for centuries with the knowledge that he can never have a mate of his own. But when mysterious fires begin appearing in his territory, with Delaney Hamilton at the center of it, he realizes that it might be harder than ever to keep history from repeating itself. Delaney has been followed by fire for months now, not knowing if she is starting them and worried that it may be the work of a stalker. Meeting Finn turns her world upside down, and things only become stranger when he insists on protecting her. Now her life depends on trusting him - but is he really who he says he is, or is there more going on?

Both Finn and Delaney were fantastic characters! I loved the depth we got from them almost immediately, learning their backstories and seeing their POVs alternating throughout the book. I felt very in tune with what their fears, desires, goals, etc. were, and it made for a rich read.
