She is outraged but that is only one of the many upsets she will be expected to endure. But, who do they think they are fooling? When has a teenager ever listened when an adults tells them no? It also seems that the deans have taken it upon themselves to ut the students at risk by insisting their tactical teams go outside of the proctective boundaries unaided to fight demons if necessary. Of course, they team Charlotte up on the losing team.

On a good note, Charlotte's relationship with Keller is finally public knowledge despite the fact that his Aunt disapproves. But that must take second seat when the demons get their hands on a mystical map that has the ability to locate anything and anybody. Apparently there is a master thief named Elam, who is the only criminal that has alluded Dean Risper in his long and allustrious career. Everyone believes he is responsible for the disappearance of the map; so, Risper goes off once again to locate him.

This third installment of Paranormal hits the ground running with action and excitement. However, for me, this edition seemed a little disjointed. Additionally, too many issues were left up in the air. The story lack a clear presence of the villain. What I mean by that is that there is a lot of running around and trying to find out whose on first but former Paranormal President Malle and the demons were noticeably absent from this read. Of the three books, this one was my least favorite. I just did not feel like much progress in the storyline had been made from the last book. I can't decide between 3 stars and 4. The book is still spilling out plots and twists that keep me attached, but I've also noticed some inconsistencies. For one, in the 2nd book her dark-mage friend Lis had fed her power

HOWEVER, in this book, it is stated, "...tried to remember what I had done with Lisabelle last semester. She had needed power and I had taken her hand and given it to her." It might have been a miss statement, but it definitely stuck out like a sore thumb.

Despite that, though, I think the characters are starting to become more strongly developed then before, I finally got to see at least a little bit of the elemental magic come into play, still hoping to see more. It seems all of her friends are SO far ahead of her magically, while C is still as inexperienced as a teen learning their way around.

I also think that everyone's distrust and dislike for C is a bit over-compensated. Outside of a few select group, everyone seems to want her dead, with the very immature and under-thought-of belief that it will suddenly make the demons leave them alone, when it's obvious to anyone with an education that the Elementals were an obvious beginning and C is just the one stitch left that they have to pull before they demons are very capable of unraveling the rest of the cloth that holds the Paranormals together. The vampires, especially, should be thankful to C for her part in saving their lives, yet her teacher and the school comity vampire absolutely loath her...why? The Princess had respect for her, as does her younger sister, yet these two high-ranked vamps can't stand her. &Although it seems a customary vamp attitude towards anyone not vampire, it's a bit obnoxious. She saved their Princess, at least give her the respect of being indifferent to her.

It's also interesting to see that the PIXIES were the one's who set the evil ex-president into her demonic stage, yet all pixies absolutely hate and want the one last elemental dead because the ex-president has gone crazy and she just seems the most immaturity obvious excuse to blame, being she's the last of her kind and the biggest threat to the president at the moment. I expected that to hit C like a club, but she just looked dumbly one in class when this was explained.
