This story is part of a series and is best read in order. Evan hasn't had much luck with his sHarmony dates and much prefers to play in a hacker hangout with Blackjoy, a fellow computer expert. Brandon enjoys playing with WrightTrigger on Hackverse and during a security update he recognizes some of WrightTrigger's work, it gives him the perfect opportunity to meet the man who intrigues him. Their relationship heats up but there are outside threats that threaten what they are building together.

Ohhhh Evan, you are a delightful and Brandon, you are just a touch sneaky. I really enjoyed this story, the groundwork is laid out early between Brandon and Evan with them first meeting on-line building up a budding friendship, and then, later meeting face to face with only one of them knowing the other is really their hacker friend. Evan and Brandon make a great couple, although they try to take it slow so Evan can be secure in his choice of man, they have a lot in common and enjoy each others company. But than Humans First (bigoted group) step up their game plan and Evan finds out the downfalls of being mated to a shifter.

This is a great storyline which I thought was great, we get a bit more information about the way shifters are treated by the human government *grrr* and we see the lengths that Humans First will go to to try and purify the world. If you're a stickler for careful editing, realistic sex, or matters of logic, you may not appreciate this book. I usually get hung up on these myself, but here I just don't care because I liked the end result. It mostly comes down to a character I loved.

Let's start with the bad, because as I read on it kept feeling better and better.

We had quite a few editing issues once again, although they were nowhere near as copious as in book one of the series. Easier to ignore by far. One thing that stood out because it came up a lot was *causal* for *casual* in all sorts of variants.

The first few things that threw me for a loop eventually turned out to have been misunderstandings on my part. The most I might complain about would be that the statements in question were too ambiguous or misleading – but in all honesty it might just be me putting things together wrong in my head, or falling prey to assumptions.

In case you're interested, let me dump them in spoiler tags (although they're not very spoilerish as such):

Hm. Is it really wise to let your blind date fetch a drink for you? Just wondering.

Hehe. So Brandon's residential area is called "Storm's Glenn"? I wonder...

Let's switch to things I liked.

I like that these two avoid getting hung up over secrets.

I like the fairly intelligent discussion about (view spoiler), since both sides make sense and they both do listen to one another.

Maybe I just really like Evan and his mindset. (No maybe about it. I totally do.) Again and again in such stories people insist they don't want to have sex yet and then do it anyway. He sticks to his guns. And when he does change his mind he does so based on pretty consistent reasoning as well.

Flipping back to the not-so-good for a moment, there is so much wrong with the pool sex scene that I can't even begin. Frankly, this is the worst way to have anal sex. Even on dry land using semen as lube is really not very helpful. But in the water it washes away too fast. In reality this either would not work or hurt like hell. (Then again, why do I keep looking for bits of reality in paranormal books? ... Probably because snippets of realism make the huge flights of fantasy feel more relatable.)

I can't really explain why or how but I absolutely love Evan. He cracks me up all the time. (I am still chuckling about "that shady looking eel", heh. (view spoiler)) It's what he says or thinks and the way he does so. It's simple but... just... yes.

Brandon's perfectly fine; your usual generic powerful, caring shifter. But Evan really elevates this book and makes me enjoy every moment. The way he thinks, his lack of drama in beautiful contrast to the way he does get affected emotionally by all the upheavals. His reactions simply make sense to me. (I am really not expressing this well; my apologies.)

On the sidelines, Quinn and (view spoiler) are adorable. I already liked Quinn in book one (where he was nothing more than a fly-by mention) but my fondness grew with actually meeting him.

Another thing I like is how everyone's reactions seem like those of normal people. Especially when it comes to action scenes and the after-effects. These are no superheroes, nor are they damsels in distress; they're just... people.

Finally, and this is really nice, the author makes sure to send us off with happiness when things wind down.

In view of all I liked here, I can live (happily) with editing issues and other niggles.
