Emma is five years old and when she was a baby, she was kidnapped by Dottie and Jack's daughter and eventually left on their doorstep to raise which they have been doing for the past five years until somebody notified the authorities and after months of deliberations Emma was returned back to her "real" family. The thing is though that during this time Dottie has passed away, leaving only Jack and Doug in Emma's life. Jack was Emma's Papa and thank goodness that he has been welcomed into Emma's new family life with open arms. This story is the relationship between Emma's real mum Megan and Jack - her adopted Papa. Jack is dying and wishes to spend as much time as he can with Emma before he leaves to be reunited with Dottie, but as Megan gets to know Jack - can she let him go? Megan's Hope follows Jack's last year month by month as we discover how each character touches one another's lives and that sometimes family really isn't just blood, but those we get to know and love.
