Logan Black was a playboy... but that all changed when he returned from the dead. Now back from years of being missing, Logan is riddled with anxiety and inability to return to the life he once lived.

I admit this title was picked up for a single word. Billionaire. I wanted a steamy read that gave me this insecure heroine that was walking into the lion's den of some wealthy CEO type. And although I got those things... it was in very short supply. This was very short. And I felt like I was tossed into the deep end right from the start. There was a lot of history on both characters that was tossed in, having to be brought up to speed quickly. I am not sure if this history is going to matter in the scheme of the story, but I wasn't really a fan of the way the information was shared. This was a lot of telling and zero showing. Maybe the history won't really matter in the story, and this just had to be put there for the set up... but it just felt like overload on information, complicated details that you had zero time to absorb.

We start to get somewhere in the story, seeing a side of Logan that is a little more human and then it's over. This first installment of this series read more like an extended prologue than a novella. This is one that I probably won't seek out going forward although I was hoping that I'd get drawn in a little bit... but sadly that was not the case.

When her brother calls to tell her that he has managed to secure her a coveted internship with the reclusive Logan Black; she is in no position to refuse.

Logan Black...billionaire...Adonis...enigma...survivor.

Haunted by the tragedy that has shaped the last four years of his life, Logan Black now lives his life as a slave to control. Control over his surroundings, his business, and himself.

Until he meets Addison.

This story has less to do with passion of the carnal sort, and more to do with a passion for living. Or rather, the loss of it.

Both Addison and Logan are hiding. Choosing to suffer in silence rather than to face their respective demons head-on.

Having both suffered life altering traumas. (Addison's being the more recent.) They are both ill equipped to cope with the stressors of their lives on their own. They soon come to find however, that the sum of their brokenness, equals the total of one beautiful relationship

The story may start with Addison, but it quickly becomes all about Logan.

Authoress, Maisey Yates, does a wonderful job of presenting Mr. Black as a dark and mysterious puzzle in desperate need of solving by both his leading lady, and the reader.

He is written in such a way that you hunger to know him and his demons. You find yourself yearning to see him break free of the shadows that plague his mind and heart. You become his champion.

The best thing about this book by far however, has to be Addison. She may be inexperienced in the bedroom, but when it comes to matters of the heart; she is all pro. Her tender heart and fierce spirit are just what our leading man needs to save him from himself.

First, I should admit I did not understand what I was reading. Yes, I saw that it was "part 1" but I assumed that meant it was the first book in a trilogy. When I opened it on my kindle, I saw it was very short, but thought it was a novella, in the same vein as the Cosmo Hot Reads.

I generally avoid anything with "Billionaire" in the title. I think that has become so overused, and such a weak word to describe someone. He has money. Okay? Not saying I don't like stories about wealthy men, but if the most important thing about him is his money, kind of boring. (I spent my twenties in the Dallas-area, knew a lot of guys with a lot of money and most of them were total jackasses who thought money was all they needed. So anyway.)

But I generally love Maisey Yates' books - her Presents books were some of the first romances I read when I

returned to reading romances, and remain some of my favorites. So when I saw this on NetGalley, of course I wanted to read it. And once I began reading it, I was so happy to see Austin from Avenge Me in the beginning of the story. (I absolute loved that book!)

But this part 1 is just like 50 pages of the story. If I'd known it was simply part of a story, I wouldn't have bothered reading it - I would have waited until I could get the entire story. I don't really understand this format. I went to amazon to try to figure out what is going on. According to their listings, this will be released in parts - 50-60 pages each - every two days. First part free (June 7), second part 99 cents (June 9), next one 2.50 (June 11) and then I think, four dollars for the fourth part (June 14). Or you could get entire story for six dollars (June 17). This concept doesn't make sense to me at all. The entire story is less than 200 pages (if the amazon listing is correct) so why split it up? Maybe there is something involved that I simply don't understand or am not aware of. Like it's a special promotion of some sort. But I don't like it, and I was incredibly disappointed when I realized last night that I didn't have an entire story.

The biggest problem though is there is nothing in the first part that makes me feel the need to keep reading it. I know that Allison likes Skittles - bought by her brother - and Logan Black doesn't wear shoes and he doesn't like being around people. That isn't enough to make me want to hurry up and purchase part two.

I'll probably read the entire book when it's available, but I really don't like the serial concept at all. I like reading a book all at once. And after reading the first part, I'm not in anyway anxiously awaiting the rest of the story.
