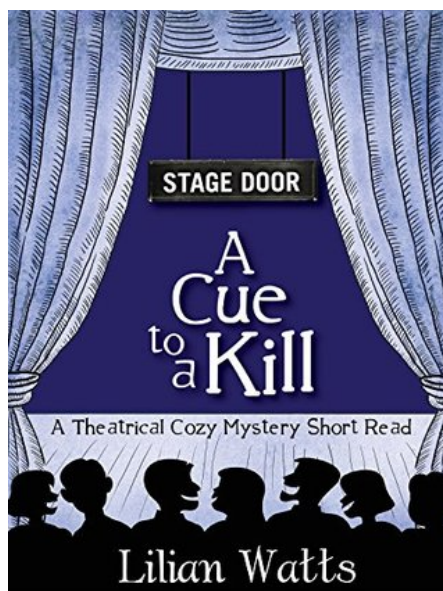




A Cue to a Kill
