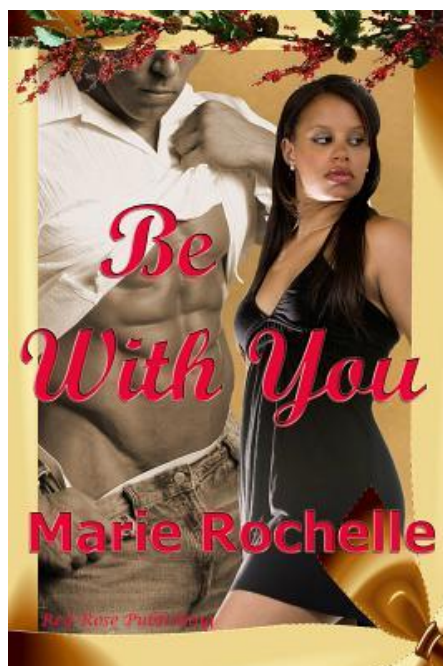




Be With You

This started out better than the last Marie Rochelle book that I read but it didnt last. I'm almost certain both characters were bipolar, especially the Hero. He literally changed his mind five times within one conversation. His personality didn't match either, he says "Im not one to mess with virgins." But yet a couple of pages before this statement he is fingering her on her desk..

She so-called dates his best friend because she is tired of waiting for the H. And how do they repay this best friend? By having oral sex in HIS kitchen while he is on the phone in the bedroom. Not to mention the time the H goes to the h's workplace(she now works for the best friend-so we are in the best friend's office now) and he "just sticks the tip in. Have I mentioned that this H is 34 and the h is 27? Or that the workplace is a youth center? And this guy calls himself a person of character.

The h is a wimp who thinks she can love the best friend so she "dates" him (but only when its convenient, she doesn't remember dating him while she is sexing it up with the H) and then accepts his proposal. They decide on a short engagement and then she goes to the H's house one night and they sleep together.. The timeline gets a little wacky here, she says her wedding is in a week. At the same time, he felt jealous and possessive toward Sage, and was livid when he thought she had slept with another man.

Also ***spoiler warning*** I don't think that Sage should have slept with Rally and then went off with the intent to marry his friend. That felt dishonest to me. I didn't think it was fair to her fiancée. I think she was trying to move on with her life, but her fiancée didn't deserve to be snuck around on, and with his best friend.

It was my first book by Rochelle and I enjoyed reading it. The chemistry was pretty hot but it had an old-fashioned love story in it's way (hence the Diana Palmer comparison). I like the combination because I am pretty vanilla when it comes to sex, but I like steamy vanilla sex in my romances. It was refreshing because I ran into issues where there were ebooks that were way too erotic for my tastes. So I am glad that they also have sweeter ebooks out there.

Like a lot of the smaller-press ebooks, it did have some editing issues, but they weren't so bad that it made it hard to read. I look forward to reading more of her books.
