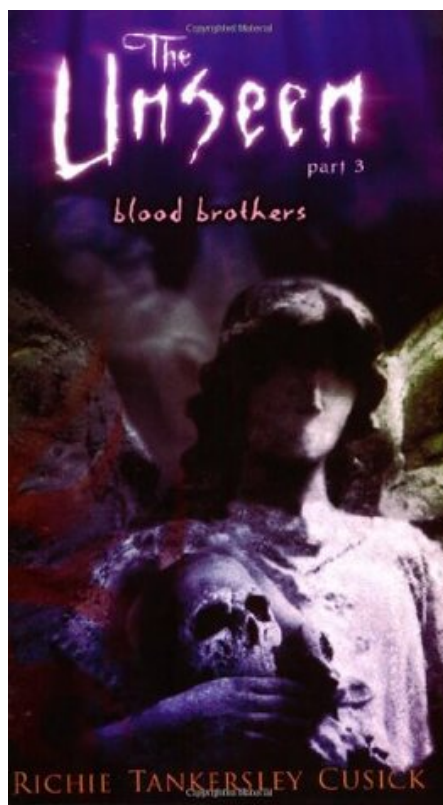




Blood Brothers

For the third installment, of this spooky paranormal series, we get a main character that is no longer rational, but has disintegrated into a blubbing... hot mess. In the first two books, she was recovering from the death of her mother, sudden disappearance of step-cousin Angela and beloved best friend Byron. So, her break with reality was much more understandable.

However, by the time readers get to the third book, we are greeted with a Lucy that can only be described as mentally unstable.

Because that is the only way to explain her odd decision to help house a severely injured guy; who claims to be Byron brother. She even mentally doubts that this mysterious guy story, but pushes it aside to risk her life in saving this stranger.
