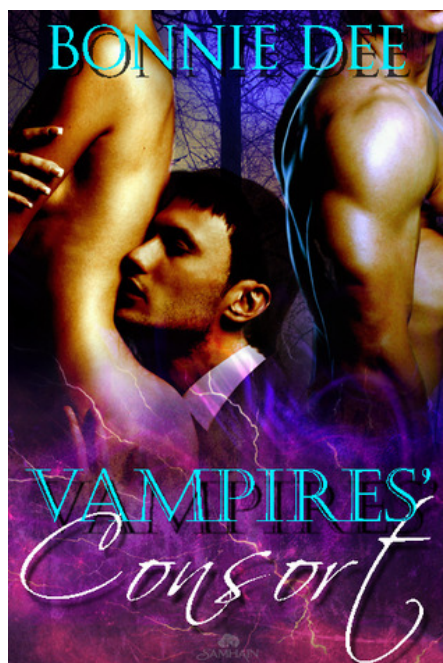

A prophecy brings Jacob Baum to meet Akila Massri, to invite her to the home of his master, vampire Valarian Kaspan. He has a proposition for her based on this prophecy. They need her to bear his heir through Jacob, the thrall who carries his blood so that the child can save the world. Akila is pretty much flabbergasted and not so thrilled on participating. But she can't deny her attraction to both Jacob and Valarian. She does manage some stellar sex with the both of them while navigating Jacob and Valarian's pretty tense relationship as master and thrall, but her part in the prophecy also puts her in danger from another, more vicious vampire.

So this had potential. The idea of the prophecy and even the threesome were quite good. There was some jealousy, but it was pretty well resolved before the end. Although, I really didn't care for Valarian's methods and his intentional use of jealousy with Jacob. I really liked the angst and tension in Jacob and Valarian's relationship and thought that added a really nice dynamic...a little more depth to their relationship. But unfortunately, the author kinda dropped the ball on that one. Jacob is unhappy in his position as thrall and his relationship with Valarian has declined and Jacob gives his reasons for this: that he only ever feels like a servant, that he can never have anything for his very own (like Akila) and that Valarian doesn't share things with him or include him in plans - he just expects him to go along with things. They have a conversation at one point and it feels like things are improving maybe (I liked how Valarian offered to back away from Akila) but then they don't have any more discussions about it. And events after this in the book indicate that Valarian has taken none of these complaints to heart as he continues to treat Jacob like a servant and doesn't really change his autocratic, selfish ways. And then at the end, Akila asks about their relationship and Valarian says they've worked things out. What? That's it? No explanation, no showing us "working things out"; they just magically fix their issues? That's sheer laziness and super disappointing, as their angst was the highlight of the romantic triangle. Also, as much as I liked all the "bloodlines" stuff and could appreciate that extra suspense aspect of the plot, the whole awakening of Akila's "god power" was a bit on the cheesy side.
