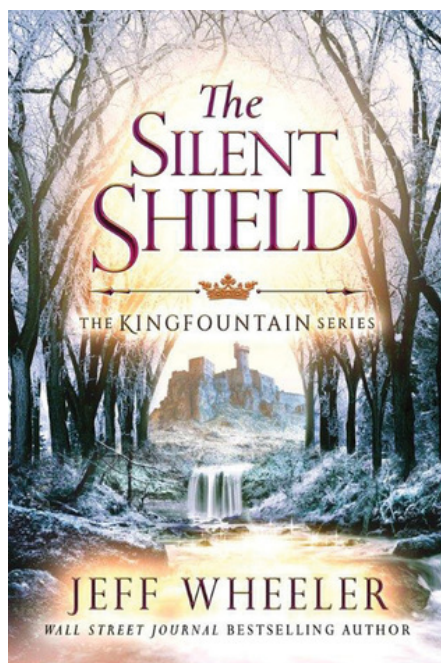

I'm so excited to have finally gotten my hands on this!! It did not disappoint. The Silent Shield sees the continuing adventures of Trneowy Kiskaddon in her quest to become an Oath Maiden, earn the seat of the Siege Perilous, and protect her King. I absolutely love this series. I cannot recommend it enough to fellow fantasy fans. Books 3-6 in particular, are reimaginings of Arthurian myth. (King Drew is Arthur, Queen Genevieve is Guinevere, Trynne is Lancelot, Morwena is Morgana, and there is a Merlin, but he is not present in this book.)

In each of the books, there is a short interlude in the chapters, often written by someone whose viewpoint we do not see or know. In this one, it was Owen Kiskaddon, and his story, told in short paragraphs was every bit as interesting as Trynne's. Owen Kiskaddon is one of my favorite fantasy heroes of this year, and seeing how he was handling his abduction had me on edge. This is the single biggest cliffhanger in The Silent Shield. I won't spoil it further by saying why.

I've said it before, I'm sure I'll say it again, but Wheeler is not afraid to put his characters through hell. There are ups and downs and they are all felt, every joy, every sadness. I was reading this on my lunch break today and I felt tears coming on, and I wasn't even sure why. Every book is a roller coaster ride of emotions. Mostly because of the characters. They are real and complex and flawed. The best ones are every shade of gray. You never know who to trust or who not to trust. You want to trust them all and know you shouldn't.

The writing is beautiful but wonderfully accessible. These are easy, fun reads and can be enjoyed in just a couple of days. The world building is rich and full of intricate details, different societies, different cultures. The magic system fascinates me and I love how Wheeler employs it.

I won't spoil the ending, but the only reason I gave this four stars and not five was because it felt a little too convenient. There is a whole other book due out in a couple of months, and I'm very intrigued to see where it is going. This almost felt like it could have been the end to the series, but I'm glad it isn't.

I highly recommend this series to anyone who enjoys fantasy!

Review: Review: Well here is my second re-write of this novel and while not being my favorite thing to do, I thought it required more discernment.

So despite the speshul 16 year old main character and her stoopid magic that saves her in every desperate situation and the 7 suitors that want to bang her, the story line does captivate. The ability to travel across realms through ley lines does add some much needed movement.

Most of the scenes were rendered in larping dialect and the princesses "tremble", "shudder", "shiver" while training to be the most fearsome only women warriors (trained by a man) in the known world. It is just endless the amount of high brow buffoonery that occurs. From a plethora of Kings and Princesses to mighty wizards and convenient magic for all.

I really hate to admit that I liked the story line. Unstable Kingdoms, war, betrayal, quests (check) and I started to pull for dumb ass to make it, despite her super speshulness. While I thought this would be like opening a box of farts on Christmas day, I did reluctantly finish.

Aaaaaaargh! I Just finished the Silent Shield and have promised to put up a review. I was SURPRISED, which almost never happens anymore, rewarded with the confirmation of many things I suspected, and came to appreciate a new side of a character I had viewed differently in a prior novel, with only a little disappointment about the resolution of one of the plot arcs involving the new generation in Kingfountain. But I can't discuss any of those things without *****SPOILERS***** while my mind races with possibilities for the next book.

I can't and won't do that to you, so this will be brief. Five Stars. Read all his other books first - set aside a week or two to do that, then make yourself comfortable with this one. You won't be disappointed.

(Assuming you have read the other Wheeler books, this one delivers. Good pacing, characters that grow, interwoven sub plots, believable politics, enough inspiration from history and myth that it feels comfortable, yet told in a refreshingly new way. Twists and turns, mysteries unraveled as their clues are slowly teased out from the pages, even as more mysteries are woven in. I probably enjoyed the Hollow Crown a tiny bit more, but the Silent Shield had a surprise reveal I'm kicking myself for not guessing earlier - and for that reason, I'll say the Silent Shield was that book's equal - a rarity in writing as a series progresses.

If you haven't read Jeff Wheeler first, this is "clean" YA fantasy with some powerful magic - more magic than in most of his prior books - but it is not a story that depends on magic so much as it is about the growth and experiences of characters who (in most cases) use magic more frequently than in past books. There are undertones of Faith woven throughout, but done so in a way that most readers would find it comports well

with their own beliefs - its not heavy on, for instance, distinctly Christian imagery like one might find in Narnia as example.)

"The Silent Shield" by Mr. Wheeler is the fifth book in his Kingfountain series but it might be the most engaging of them all.

We find Trynne as a young adult now grappling with the constant tragedies befalling her family and kingdom. All the while, she has to keep a secret about who she really is and what she is trying to accomplish. In many ways, beyond the Arthurian legend connections, this almost feels like a superhero origin story for Trynne. This story along with book 4 really dives into her motivations and how much she has grown as a woman, oath maiden, daughter, friend, warrior, and more.

I won't spoil anything but the details sprinkled throughout the story will get any fan of Mr. Wheeler's work super excited. There are more mentions to the larger universe at play from some of other books in the "Wheeler-verse", which only makes me want to go back and reread everything to see where the other connections might be.

I can only look forward to what happens next to this kingdom and the Kisskadon family. As always, I cannot recommend this tale enough.
