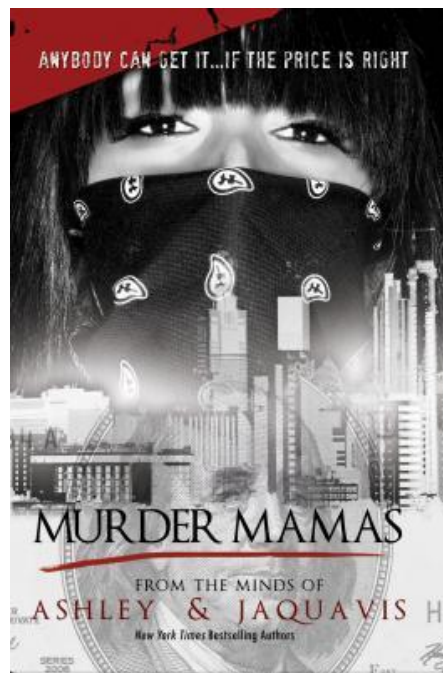




Murder Mamas
