I have to start by saying this book exceeded all my wildest expectations. When I first came across the posting for the book on Facebook I didn't expect the quality and depth of detail and knowledge. The premise is intriguing. I didn't read the description of the book before purchasing it from Kindle because I was intrigued by what Mr Drake had written and from the title and the dragon on the cover alone I was hooked.

I am a big fan of mythology and fantasy and this book in no way disappoints. It includes various different mythologies from different cultures and gives them all a common ancestry and acceptance that most if not all exist. At no time does it feel cluttered with the various ideologies. As the story progresses it only further cements their co-existence and goes on to cover two of my favourites, Norse mythology and the legends of King Arthur. The main cast of characters known as the Majjai have a wide array of magical powers covering time travel, flight, healing and sorcery. I won't go into too much detail as I don't want to spoil the book. There powers are a mixture of supernatural and also similar to those of comic book superheroes. This in itself is another strong selling point for me as I am a massive comic book fan.

The story is told in the current tense which adds to the immediacy and intensity of the book. The story unfolds at a steady pace and it is easy to warm towards the main protagonist Atticus whose origins are both tragic and mysterious at the same time and are only truly revealed as the story progresses. I like the fact that the school is able to maintain the façade of being a place for children with educational difficulties and mixing these kids in with the kids who are potential majjai. In other stories which have a similar school they tend to be exclusive to the children they have been created for.

I do agree with some of the other reviewers who state that the detail is a little sparse in a few areas but this is more than made up for in the level of detail when it is described in particular when describing other realms. The whole fight of good versus evil in a supernatural setting is far from original but this book has done a brilliant job of giving the fight a refreshing flair and twist. The level of detail in creating emotional believable characters only further strengthens the whole appeal.

I do not want to go into any more detail as I don't want to spoil the book. It is well worth a read and the ending only makes me pine for the further books in the series all the more. As a first book it is incredibly well written and I would love for this to get the treatment it deserves with a movie series in the future.
