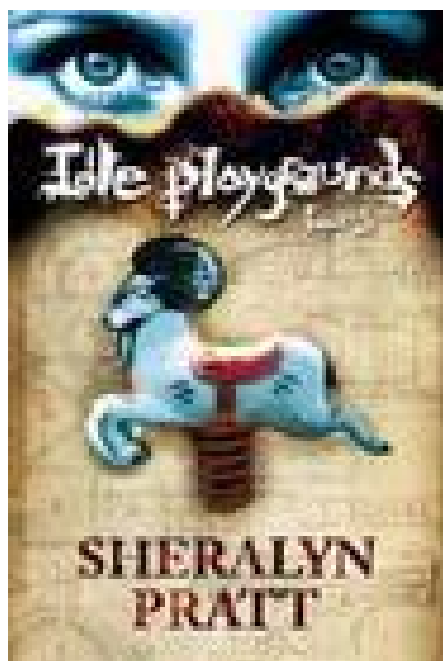




Idle Playgrounds

Then problems start arising, and Rhea has to hide out with Ty and Kay. And she also warns "her" missionary who has come to Utah to move to Provo and go to BYU. Anyway, to not tell the whole story, there is a lot of high speed chases, shooting (some with tranquilizers) and ultimatums. At the end Rhea is told she accepts a job or people will die.

Anyway, my heart was pumping so much, I just had to keep reading. I loved it. If you don't read books 1 and 2 you won't understand it so much, but read them and be prepared not to put this one down!!!!
