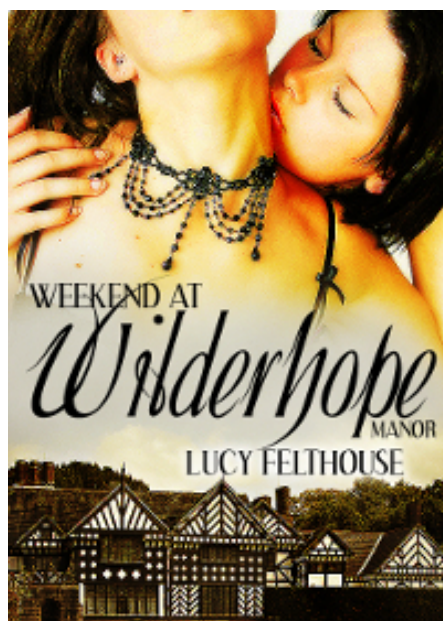




Weekend at Wilderhope Manor
