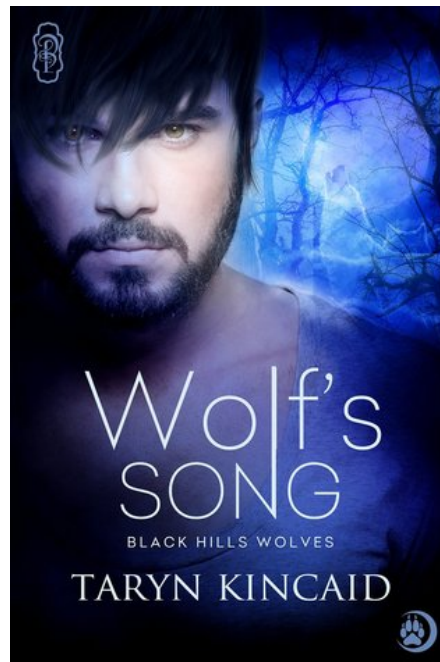




Wolf's Song

So she starts to bring him trinkets and singing her birdsong to him until he seems to snap out of his funk.

I love shifter romances and gobble them up at every chance I get. I loved the unlikely connection between Brick, a wolf shifter, and Summer, a skinwalker who belongs to the feline clan but can take any form she chooses, and her preferred form is a raven. When the pair first "meet", Summer is perched high on a treetop as she takes in the younger version of a beaten and bedraggled Brick. Attempting to move him out of a prone stupor, she begins dropping shiny bobbles on his porch -- sort of "get well soon" gifts. Little did they know that the state of their relationship would change from that one decision. Brick doesn't know that Summer is a skinwalker -- originally at least. All he knows is that he has an easy companionability with this bird. He even "names" her, which is totally adorable. But when Brick does find out who Summer is, both man and wolf want her desperately. And Summer wants him equally as fervent in return. Unfortunately, the couple are from two competing species. Summer's uncle is the head of the feline clan in the area and he will stop at nothing to take over the wolf territory. Starting with Brick's home. The couple have to quickly battle the odds for their love and peace between them their species.

Although I enjoyed the story, I would have loved more back story about the characters. Potentially that story was provided in the earlier books in the series but without the benefit of reading them I can't be sure. But I would have liked to know the origin of Brick's ability, was he a special shifter of some kind? And I also would have enjoyed knowing more about the Skinwalker's. There were quite a bit of unique concepts in the story that I felt as if I was missing something because of the fast pacing of the story. I would have enjoyed a much longer read to discover more.
