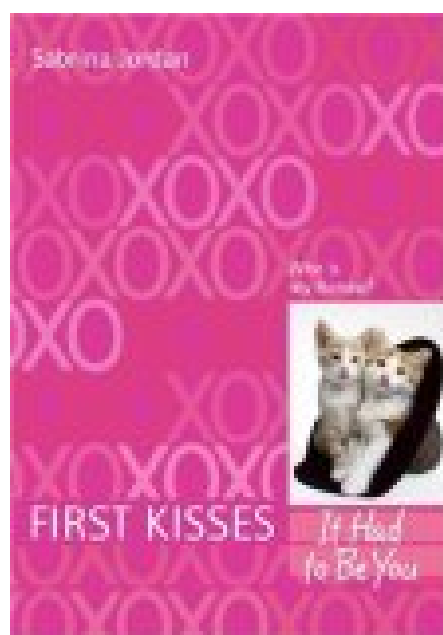




It Had to Be You
