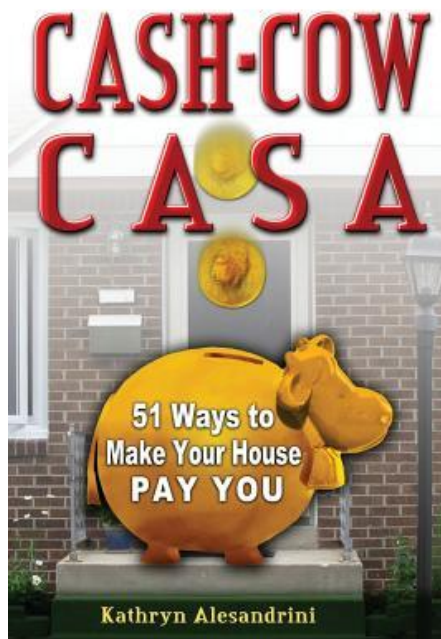

The different ideas are divided into chapters of related topics; at the end of the book are a list of all 51 Ideas and a list of footnotes where the ideas can be explored. The author gives the idea, instructions how to make it happen easily, do's and don'ts and cautions about liability. The book is well researched and presented in an organized manner with a few antidotes of funny stories mixed into increase interest. Each small section is labeled with sub-headings so you can go back to an idea and study the one that interests you.
