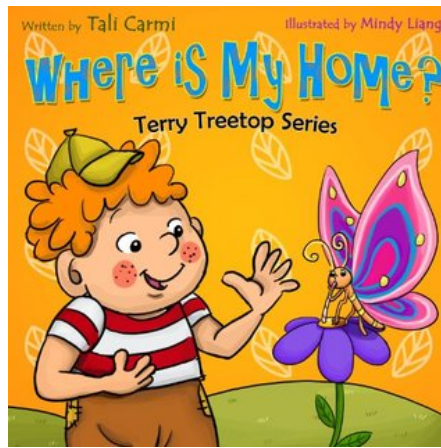




Where Is My Home?

In this adventure Terry chases a butterfly when he suddenly doesn't know where he is. Where is My Home is a sweet children's book that seems well aimed at the 3-8 year old audience. This book contains adorable, child friendly, illustrations and life lessons.
