eye on evils in the world. Dan is a do-er. Falling in love with a firm closet-case does not bode well for Dan. He is also stubborn, tough, and a huge pain in the ass. I still love him though.

Nick makes my knees weak. He is without a doubt Chief Yummypants and I couldn't get enough. He is patient yet fierce. He is hidden yet on the front lines. He is dominant yet submissive. He is flippin' awesome. He hits a crossroads in his life. Tough decisions will have to be made.
