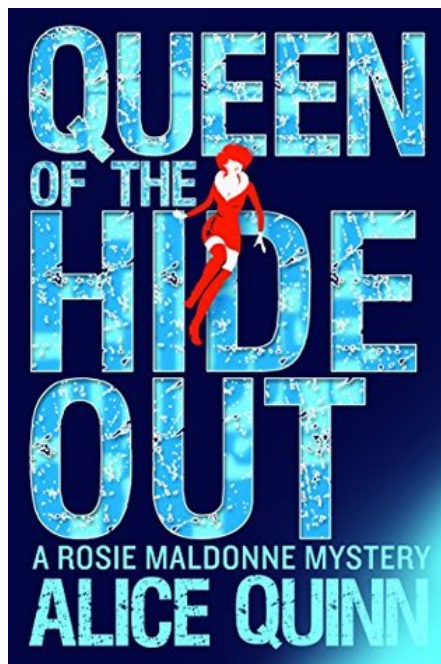




Queen of the Hide Out
