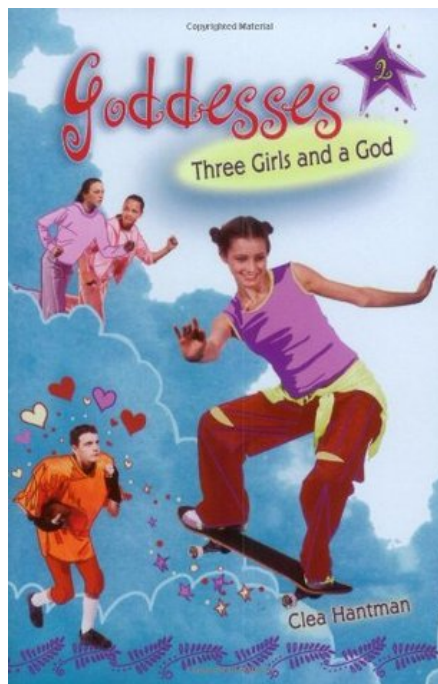




Three Girls and a God
