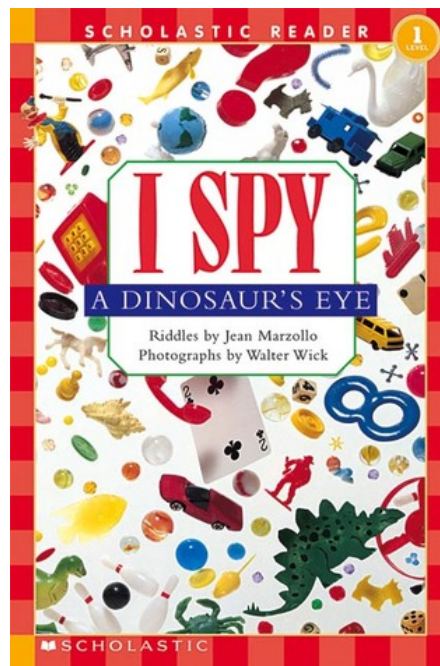




I Spy a Dinosaur's Eye
