The hero was a complete manwhore in the past, but what made it possible for me to get through was that there were no details of his past with women, just that he obviously was a rogue. He was also arrogant, but not overly so where I wanted to punch him. Lastly, the fact that the heroine was also experienced and not a timid and naive "innocent" helped as well.

The hero was a bit of a jerk, in that it took so long for him to fall in love with her and he was going to leave her even though they had a connection. It angered me, and it also made me not like him as much as I could have.
