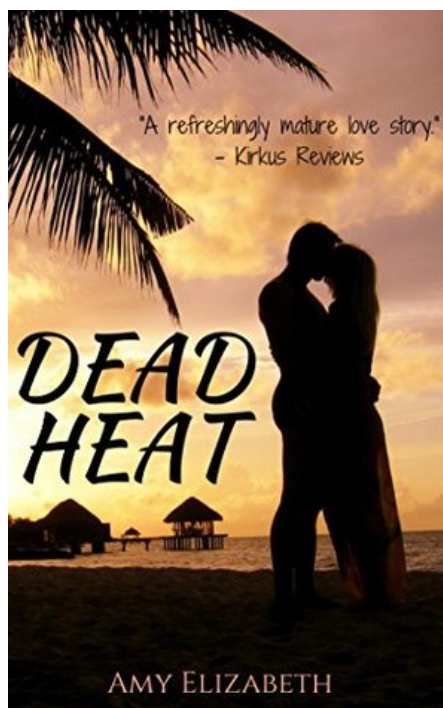




Dead Heat
