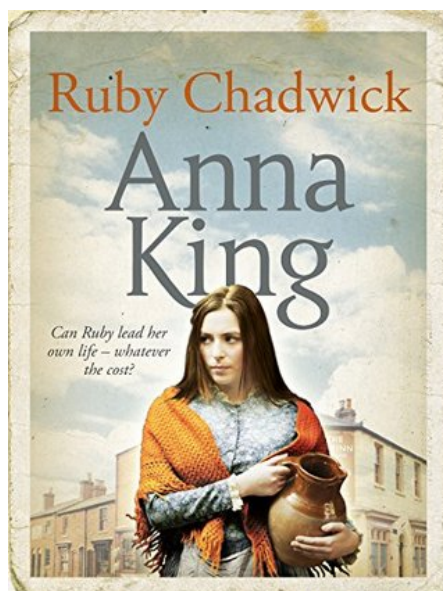




Ruby Chadwick
