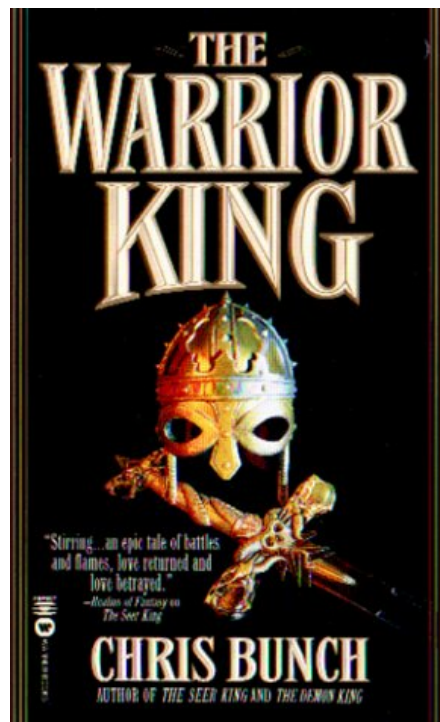




The Warrior King
