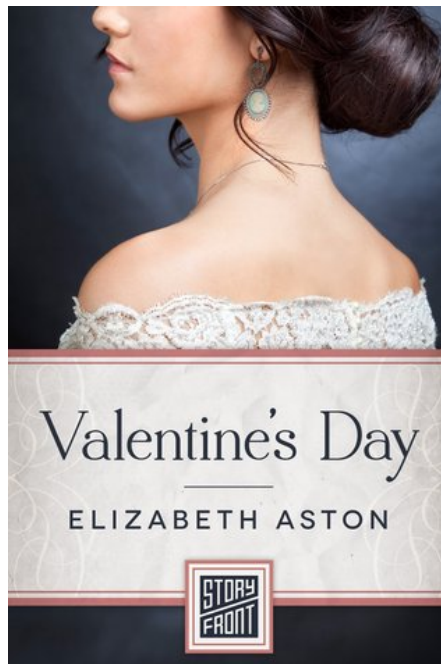

Aston is a favorite with me, due to her fantastic P&P spinoffs. This was a very quick read, a novella in which she explores the return to England of her heroine, Valentine Welburn, from the fragrant and warm shores of India. The heroine shows up in London after a long ship voyage with her chaperones, a set of parents and children whom she knew in Calcutta. Upon arrival, she displays behavior that helps the reader to see that she is no shrinking violet. She deftly escapes her chaperones' watching eyes and hires a hansom cab to take her to the home of her godfather, with whom she plans to spend her first London season, though a first being undertaken at an older age than that of young society belles. Lord Marbeck, an acquaintance of her godfather, stumbles upon her at the dock and insists on riding his horse beside her hansom, behavior altogether disagreeable to her. The novella was short and had to wrap up quickly, so it becomes very visible

early on that Valentine and Marbeck will be a great match, once they get past what they find irksome in one another, much in the vein of Lizzy and Darcy. Very enjoyable read.
