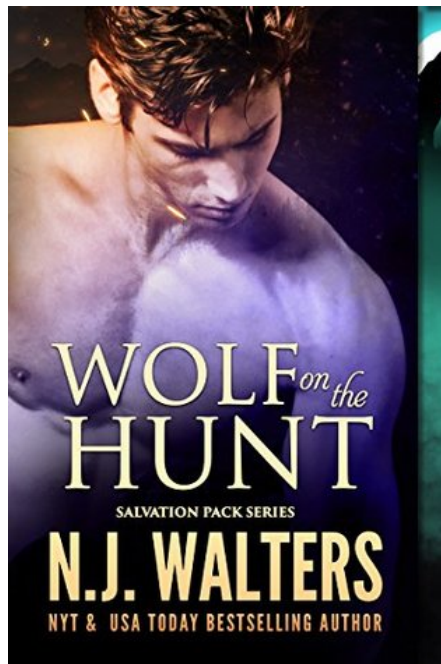




Wolf on the Hunt

I received a free copy of this book to read and review for Wicked Reads.

One of the best things about reading books by your favorite authors is that you know whether or not you can pick up a book in the middle of a series and read it without being lost. As someone who has read several of Walters series, I knew that when I started the Salvation Pack series at book four I could do so with very little to no confusion. Despite not having a chance to go back and read the first three books in the series yet (even though I bought them), I had no qualms about reading *Wolf on the Hunt*. I love Walters' writing style and knew without a doubt that I would love this book too. I was right.

As the last single wolf standing from the founders of the Salvation Pack, Louis LaForge has accepted his fate to remain single for the remainder of his life. He takes pride in being the pack's protector and will defend all of its members with his very last breath if need be. Despite his father's best efforts, he harbors only love and loyalty to his brother and Alpha, Jacque, and this merely strengthens his resolve to protect the pack. But when Louis is caught unaware by a group of hunters, he ends up receiving multiple bullet wounds, losing blood, and not enough time to heal as the hunters are closing in on him. Fortunately, he's close to Anny's old house and the new renter is a compassionate artist who cannot abide the thought of the hunters killing the injured wolf. Even though she knows she's nuts for trying to help a wild animal, Gray helps the wolf inside and manages to hide him from the hunters. She soon realizes that there is more to the wolf than it seems and confronts it/him about what it truly is. I'm not sure who was shocked more when Louis shifted to his human form, but catching the Gray's scent made continuing to lie to her out of the question. But learning that shifters are real is only the first of many revelations that Gray experiences and they rock the entire foundation of her world. Which is just as well because life will never be the same again for Gray now that Louis has discovered his mate.

Although this is only the second book in the series I've read, I had no issues with keeping up with the storyline. Walters does an excellent job of giving you enough background info on the series with each installment that you don't necessarily have to start at the beginning. That said, I cannot wait to read them all. I loved the twist on who Gray is that the author introduced because it set the series up for additional installments now that all five of the men have mated. This is joyful news for me because I love this author's paranormal romances, so anytime I can get my hands on more, it's always a good thing. Considering that Louis was the focus of this installment, it made sense that things between the Salvation Pack and Louis and Jacque's father finally came to a head. I loved the intensity of the action in *Wolf on the Hunt* and was actually worried at times during the final fight scene because even though I know this author always gives her readers a happy ending, I couldn't help but worry. That's how action-packed and fast moving the events were at the end. While the fight ultimately ended the way I hoped, it was not without significant bloodshed on both sides. It was awesome! I loved *Wolf on the Hunt* and cannot wait to see where *Wolf on a Mission* takes the Salvation Pack next.

I haven't read any of the previous books in the series and this is book 5. It might sound like a recipe for disaster, but it really wasn't that hard to jump into this world. Sure, the beginning was a little more challenging to follow, but once I got into the book it was well worth the effort.

This book joins a pack of wolves that have split from their abusive, old-school pack leader. Most of them have already found their mates and their group has grown into a pack of its own. One of the last to find a mate, Louis has accepted that he will just have to accept his role as pack protector and stop hoping for the love of his life to walk into the woods. Just as he's accepted this, of course, a woman just so happens to move into the woods. OK, so it might not be exactly the woods, but it is another pack mate's old house, and it's close enough to the woods to let these two meet.

Gray has always had an affinity for nature. She is an artist who has not quite figured out where she wants to put down roots. She moves around quite a bit for her work, but has constant company in the form of her half-wolf. Her love of nature and animals is what ultimately leads her to save a wounded wolf on the run from some illegal hunters. That wolf ends up being so much more than she imagined. Louis would have felt guilty about putting such a burden on Gray if he wasn't immediately smitten. These two immediately have chemistry that lights up the pages. When we weren't spending time with them in the bedroom, we were watching them both try to make room in their lives for one another.

Aside from the obvious romantic storyline, we also get to see the conclusion of the tension between the old and new packs. This book had a really great blend of action, romance, and world-building. Now I wish I had discovered this series earlier!

I've been waiting for Louis to find his mate, and what an excellent choice the fates have in mind for him in Gray. An artist who creates the most beautiful nature paintings and drawings, Gray has come to the Salvation area to simply soak up the beauty around her in order to do some dedicated painting. She and her wolf/shepard mix dog and constant companion, Shadow, expected quiet, nature's beauty and some time to relax. What she discovered was far, far from her expectations.

Louis is enjoying life. Since leaving his insane father's pack, he and his brother and pack mates have created a good place, a strong pack and life would be perfect but for two things – the fact that his father intends to kill all of them at the first chance for daring to leave his pack, and out of all the members of his new pack, Louis is still without his mate. Of course, there is never a guarantee that he'd ever find that one woman who is his alone, his mate, his love – but watching the happiness that finding their mates has brought to his brother and pack mates leaves a bit of a hole in Louis' perfect life. Loneliness is a thorn in his side that he believes he's just going to have to endure.

While out on patrol, Louis is attacked by hunters while in his wolf form. Hiding from the hunters, bullets painfully scattered within him. Louis is astounded to see a woman and her pet come out of the forest to his aid. It cannot be, not like this – but yes, this brave woman who is facing what she believes to be a wild wolf and is willing to shelter and protect that wolf from the hunters... she is his mate. With new strength and determination Louis goes with the woman and allows her to tend to his wounds... and tries to figure out how to let her know that he's not exactly what he seems.

Wolf On The Hunt is such a fast paced, intense story of love, acceptance and family, blood or not. Gray has a surprise of her own and when Louis tells her exactly what she is, aside from his mate, her life is suddenly complicated and makes perfect sense at the same time. Answers are always better than not understanding, but this is a lot to take in. Louis will do everything in his power to show Gray that she is his mate, meant to be together within his pack – and Gray will hesitate, longing and fear fighting within her as she gets to know the Salvation Pack and decides what her future holds. Of course, old enemies return and finally there is a resolution to an ongoing battle for peace.

I really enjoyed this one and I believe anyone who enjoys Shifter Romance would as well. This is the fifth story in the Salvation Pack series. I believe that even if you haven't read the earlier books that you would enjoy this story. There is enough back story and explanation of who everyone is to make it a smooth story without glaring holes that you need filled in. Yes, of course any series is best read from the beginning – but you don't have to in order to enjoy Louis and Gray's story.

When he is rescued by Gray he finds himself attracted to her and doesn't quite understand what makes her so different. Once he figures out her secret, he knows she is the one for him. His pack welcomes her with open arms which is something that has been missing from her life. Unfortunately, the hunters aren't ready to go away and his former pack isn't finished with the Salvation pack...what's a protector to do!

What is there to not like about Gray and Louis? He's funny and charming on top of being a great protector. She's strong and gentle at the same time while having this lonely awkward side as well. Plus she has a giant

Wolf on the hunt is the 5th novel in the Salvation Pack series, of which I already reviewed the previous volume, Wolf from the Past last October, and finish pleasantly the plot arc with our heroes' old pack.

One thing we can't reproach to the author is to repeat herself with the heroines. Indeed, our new heroine, Gray, is a half-blood, half werewolf half human, but doesn't know it. That leads in her to sharp senses and an affinity to wild nature she paints with success. When she meets Louis and learns what he is and what she is, she's very curious, but she stays leery and not really ready to be involved, which I understood perfectly coming from a loner like her. Their meeting too is quite unusual: she finds a wounded wolf in the woods near her home and she puts it inside her house to hide it from the hunters. Of course it's no ordinary wolf.

The hero is more typical: alpha male ready to do anything to protect his pack, he's also certain of himself really fast concerning Gray. However he seems to be attentive to her doubts and he lets her take her decisions on her own.

As always with N.J. Walters, the sex scenes are very detailed but really pleasant to read. What I reproach to this series can be found here too: everything happens too fast. They've only known each other for a few days when they profess their love to the other. However we can see an evolution of their thoughts and of their feelings too, and that was only at some times that I would remember only a few days had past in reality.

We finally have the conclusion of the quarrel with the hero's father's pack, and I must say the tension grows constantly during the all book, and the final battle scene is well written. There's by the way the intervention of characters I wasn't waiting for at first – at least not like that – and that was a good idea IMO.

So Wolf on the Hunt is a good episode for this series in spite of its little flaw, and for me it could have been a good conclusion. But I was surprised to see N.J. Walters is going on with this series with a new volume to be published in April. I guess the new plot arc will turn around the hunters who wounded Louis, but we'll see.
